A Snapshot of the Intensive Mental Health Unit (IMHU)

The IMHU opened on February 15, 2014

- Original legislation included sunset provision for August 1, 2017
- LD 1223 (2017) removed sunset provision now in effect

Daily Population

Since opening, the average daily population of the IMHU has been:

Referrals

From 2014 to present the IMHU has had 250 reterrals (DOC and County Jail referrals)

Referral process is quicker given prior knowledge of the client.

Length of Stay

Of those admitted to the IMHU, the average length of stay for those discharged from the unit (to General Population (GP), release, or other placement): 52 days

Average stay for unsentenced residents: 52 days

Average stay for sentenced residents: 78 days
This is skewed by the residents who are not able to be discharged due to their illness.

Residents in the IMHU since it was opened: 9

Forced Medication

Through February 2019, the IMHU has received 29 residents who have needed involuntary medication (5 in 2018).

Client Acuity

The IMHU essentially functions as three units in one, with the following three populations housed in the unit:

- Acute Typically the group requiring a hospital level of care due to functional deficits related to their mental illness.
- **Sub-acute** Some improvement in functioning usually follows a period of med compliance wherein the individual is able to safely participate in the milieu of the unit to some degree.
- Chronic Inmates with extended histories of functional impairment that requires extensive skill building and/or treatment. Improvement may result in a return to population though some will never be able to do so.

The residents of the IMHU most often are diagnosed with mood disorders, schizoaffective disorder and addiction.

- Many of the short termers have schizophrenia and we are often able to get them into the mental health system;
- However, the *majority* of the residents have cosecurring disorders.
 - -Substance abuse
 - -Head Injuries
 - -Major Medical Issues
