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On Behalf of the Maine Board of Tax Appeals Rulemaking Activity Proposed Rule

MRS, on behalf of the Maine Board of Tax Appeals, is including the following summary of proposed updates to the Maine of Board of Tax Appeals Rule 100 for interested taxpayers and tax professionals.

Rule 100, "Maine Board of Tax Appeals Practice and Procedure." The Maine Board of Tax Appeals is proposing to update 18-674 C.M.R. ch. 100 § 105(1) to reflect changes made by P.L. 2023, c. 412 to 36 M.R.S.A. § 151(2)(C) limiting the jurisdiction of the Maine Board of Tax Appeals to matters where the amount in controversy is \$500,000 or less, which became effective October 25, 2023.
