I. FILING OF DETAILED ISSUES LIST & STATEMENTS

Except as indicated below, the parties shall file: a) a detailed and complete listing of the issues that each would like to address at the hearing; b) a list of witnesses, if any; and c) any comments on the need for pre-filed testimony.

For each issue, the listing must be in sufficient detail to fully apprise the Commission, the Applicant, and other parties as to the specific topic sought to be addressed at the hearing, and must contain a statement of the issue and identify the associated statutory and/or regulatory criteria that make the issue relevant to the Commission's review. Any specific suggestions on how to address the issue should be identified. Due to the nature and purpose of zoning petition materials, the Applicant tis not required to file a list of issues.

The list of witnesses shall include their qualifications and identify the issues or topics on which they will be testifying.

Filings on this item shall be submitted electronically to Tim Beaucage, and copied to all the parties, by **5:00 PM December 11th**. The Commission recognizes that once the issues list and witness list are submitted, there may be a need for a pre-hearing conference to discuss supplementing a party's witness list.

II. OTHER MATTERS

A. Deadlines Previously Set

Section I,B of the First Procedural Order set a deadline of 5:00 PM November 6th for the Applicant to "provide each party granted intervenor status with a complete paper and electronic copy of the petition (as deemed complete for processing by the Commission)" and to provide "10 complete paper copies to the LUPC staff for distribution to each Commissioner."

Due to recent severe weather events that resulted in power outages, the Applicant shall provide the required copies as soon as reasonably possible. Priority should be given to providing copies to the Intervenors. Production of the copies for the Intervenors after 5:00 PM November 13th may result in the need to adjust the deadline set above in Section I of this Order.
