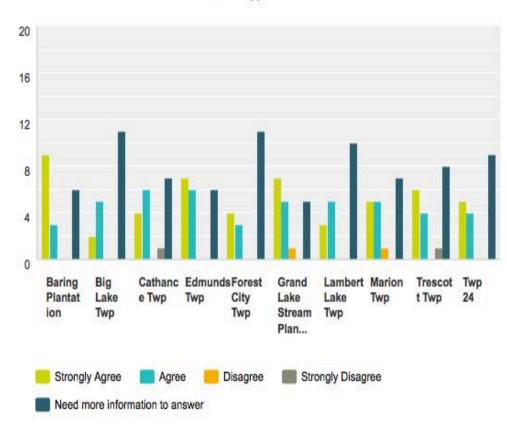

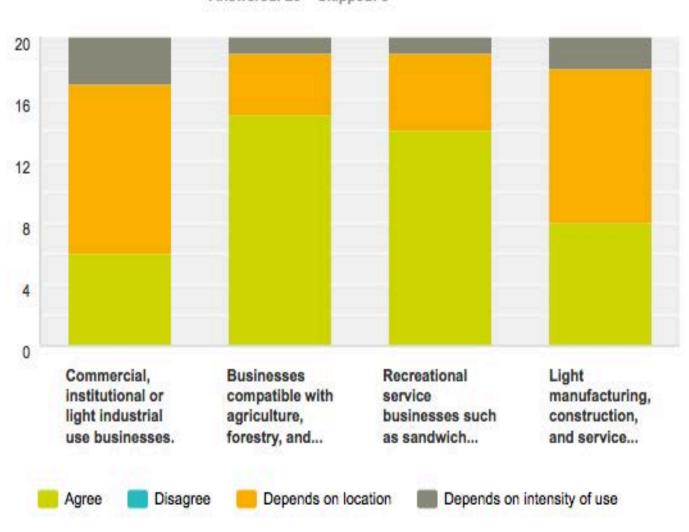

Answered: 19 Skipped: 6



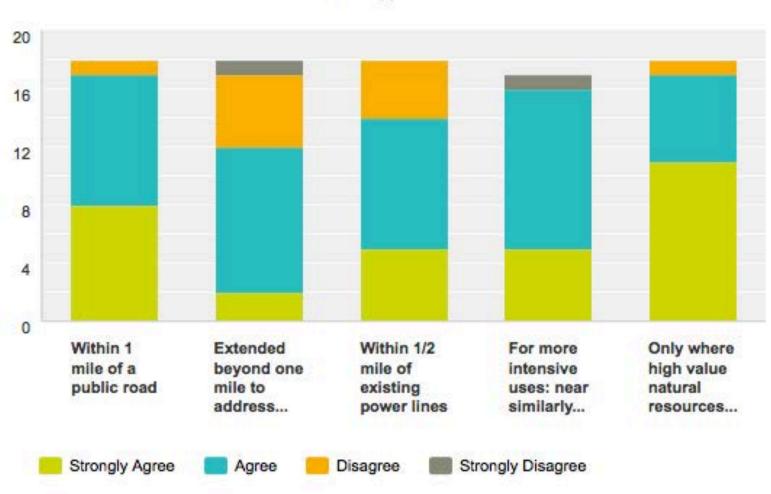
Please indicate your agreement/disagreement with various types of rural businesses.

NEW rural Business zones – input on Standards

Responses/conclusions – most important:

- Locate away from existing residences: larger scale commercial,
- Locate close to resource it supports/uses: recreational service
- Close to similar development: moderate-scale business, retail, restaurants

Responses/conclusions – next important:

Buffer for noise: large scale commercial

Survey Ambiguity

- 17 out of 25 responded to first set of standards;
- Dropped to 14, then 12 for next 2 sets.

NEW Rural Business zones – Decisions from Survey?

Tension in questions: specific, technical ordinance language – and – general principles (2nd iteration of survey lost detail and clarity)

Some useful impacts:

- Stakeholders are aware of floating zone concept
- Received a range of input on levels of support for rural business

Did not learn much; i.e., we know this already:

- Roads, broadband, labor are limiting factors
- Locate recreation near recreation assets
- Locate large scale commercial away from residences
- Cluster services with similar development for moderate-scale business, retail, restaurants

Where to go from here?

NEW Rural Business zones – Decisions from Survey?

Development – Rural Business (D-RB)

- Review redlined text (15 pages) of D-RB for Aroostook as a group and make minor adjustments
- Go with the 3 tiers of UTs/Plantations in Washington county where it will apply

Development – Recreational Services Business (D-RSB)

- Discuss/agree on Concepts: (ask LUPC staff to draft language for their rules?)
 - Within 1/4 mile of recreational asset cluster (trailhead, boat launch, sporting camp)
 - Choose townships where it applies from recreation cluster analysis, visual intensity of assets as criterion,
 - Establish intensity of use: size of facility, footprint, distance from other potentially conflicting uses, minimal parking, wastewater, drinking water standards, others?
 - Rental and minor repair but not manufacturing
 - Food and drink but not lodging
 - Good neighbor standards re: lighting, noise, hours of operation, trucks and deliveries, on-site
 parking if renting boats and bikes and leaving for day or overnight
