



Checklist For Renters



- Know the local rules, regulations, ordinances, and laws. Being a good guest ensures that short-term rentals aren't a nuisance for neighbors. If you wouldn't do it at home, don't do it here!
-  Check the safety information for the property. Are there adequate smoke alarms? Does the owner provide information about testing the drinking water?
- Make sure you don't invite too many guests. Stick to the occupancy limit on the rental listing for the safety of the community and the environment.
- Plan [where to dump your holding tank](#) if you're staying at a residential campsite with your recreational vehicle. 
- Understand how to contact emergency services, where local emergency services are, and how to get them to your rental property if needed.
-  Check and clean all boats and vehicles to remove invasive plants.
- If you are planning a campfire, leave firewood at home and [buy it where you burn it](#)! Be sure to apply for the [proper permits](#) and check to make sure campfires are allowed at the rental. Visit the [Maine Forest Service Forest Protection webpage](#) for more information about
