Executive Summary

Pursuant to 12 §10353, sub-§6, the Bureau of Warden Service may provide assistance to other entities including county, state and municipal agencies, private organizations and persons. The director of the Bureau of Warden Service may charge the entities or individuals for these services. Last year, the warden service provided 76 details, totaling 426 hours and \$32,814.76. The Warden Service also responded to over 700 calls to assist other agencies as part of their routine work.

Background

- As a state law enforcement agency, the Maine Warden Service routinely responds to law enforcement calls for assistance from other agencies. These calls for assistance are most generally part of a game warden's routine work throughout the day and are considered non-reimbursed requests for assistance.
- Reimbursed requests for assistance most generally are completed based on memorandums of understanding or agreements in order to provide specific and focused enforcement efforts in addition to routine patrol work. Examples of this work would include but are not limited to endangered species protection work, aquatic invasive species mitigation as well as focused watercraft enforcement on certain bodies of water.
