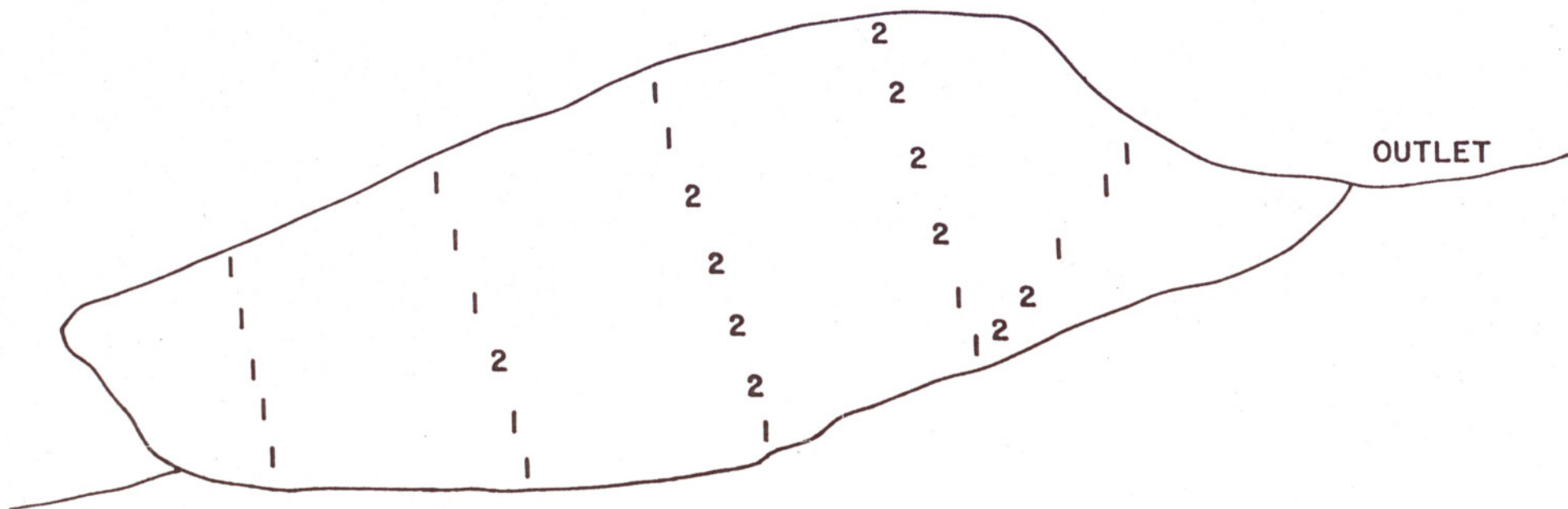

Carlisle Pond is very shallow with a muddy bottom and abundant aquatic vegetation. The pond is surrounded by a fringe of heath and black spruce bog. Water temperatures become warm during hot weather, forcing trout to seek the cool water of springs and inlets. When water temperatures are cool, trout move freely throughout the pond.

Carlisle Pond has an abundant food supply for brook trout, and trout growth is good. The trout population is maintained by adequate natural reproduction in spring areas and in the main inlet.
