Pond can be accessed over gravel roads maintained by private landowners for land management purposes. Small watercraft must be hand-carried a short distance to access the Lake.

Weeks Pond is a shallow, silt-bottomed pond that supports a good population of brook trout. The Pond is surrounded by a narrow margin of bog plants. Beaver activity at the outlet can deepen the pond by about 2 feet. One small tributary provides good spawning habitat for brook trout. Historically, competition from only two minnow species was light, but creek chub have recently been introduced illegally and may be a serious competitor with trout.

Weeks Pond is managed with fishery regulations to prevent the introduction of any new fish species. The
