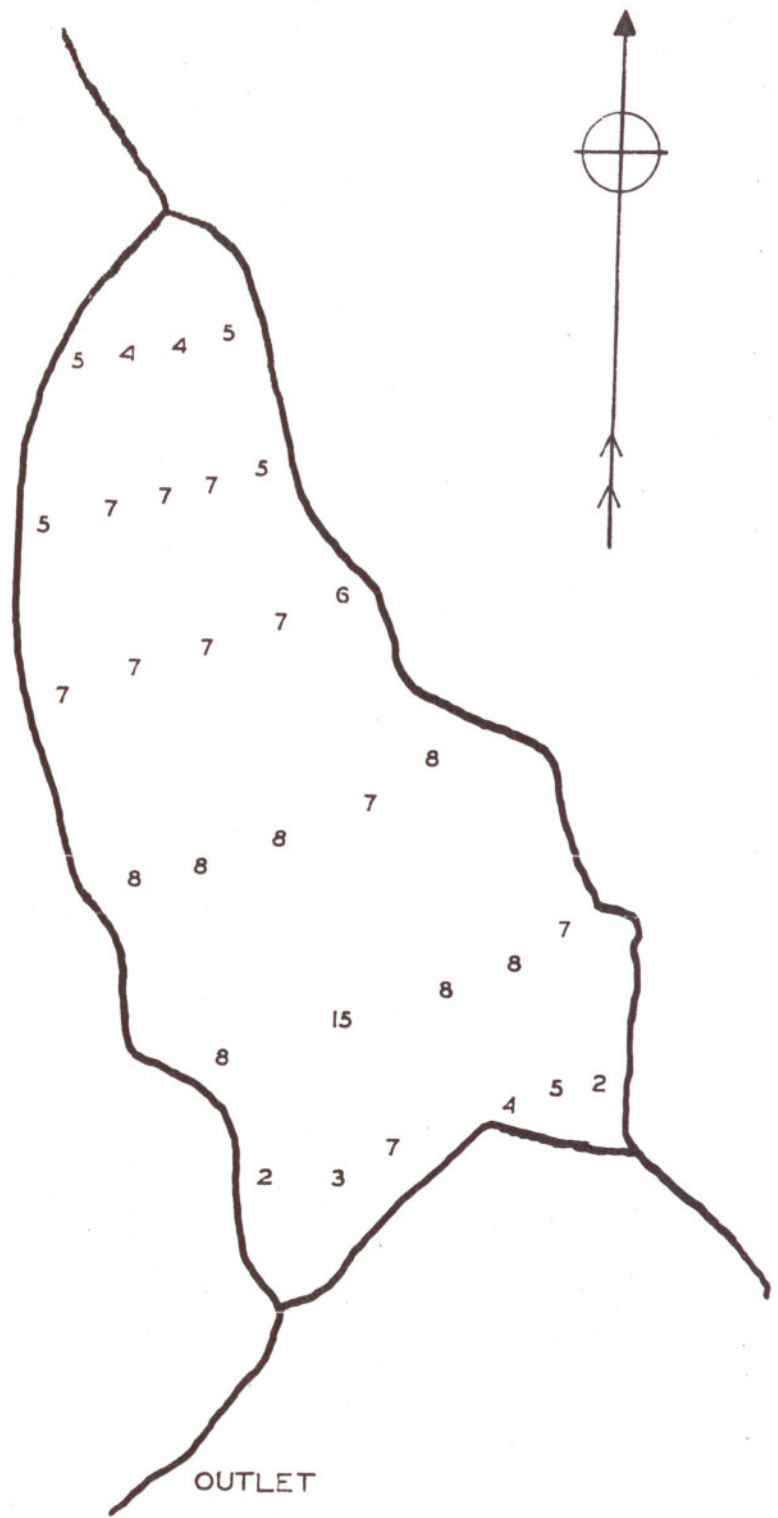
Principal fisheries: Largemouth bass, and chain pickerel

Farrington Pond is located northeast of Kezar Lake's Lower Bay. The majority of the pond is very shallow with soft substrates that support dense beds of aquatic weeds. The physical characteristics of the pond and water quality parameters preclude management for coldwater fish. However, the pond is well suited for many of the existing warmwater species. Largemouth bass and pickerel provide good angling opportunities. Smallmouth bass have been reported, but there is little to no preferred habitat available and their occurrence is quite rare.

A traditional access site is located near the southeastern end of the pond, which is best suited for car-top boats and canoes. These access conditions could be terminated in the future, and there is a need to secure permanent public access to waters like Farrington Pond.
