

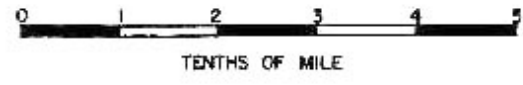

Hammond Pond provides excellent habitat for warmwater sport fish. Black crappies have become established since the original survey and now maintain a very popular winter fishery. The abundant white perch population makes Hammond Pond an ideal place for both the beginner angler and the angler who likes constant action. A trailerable boat launch is located on the inlet stream a short distance from the pond.
