Issues and Concerns Raised by Black Racer Working Group August 29, 2007

- 1. Why are the black racer listed as an Endangered Species in Maine?
- 2. After being involved in the Shorebird Significant Habitat Rulemaking process, I feel the Department need to work closely with townships and other potentially affected entities early in the process if they plan to develop regulatory habitat protections for the black racer.
- 3. The federal Landowner Incentive Program (LIP) will receive no funding this coming fiscal year; are there other tools or funding sources that can fill this need?
- Beginning with Habitat (BwH) data are non-regulatory and often do not affect land use decisions by towns. BwH non-regulatory data do not carry much weight or influence. BwH data should include a stronger regulatory component – this would be more helpful for town planners.
- 5. Endangered and Threatened species data should be made available to towns as soon as possible.
- 6. What should be considered the baseline population for black racers in Maine given historical fluctuations in abundance and distribution?
- 7. What are the limiting factors for black racers at the northern edge of their range food and winter survivorship? Will these questions be studied?
- 8. What are the advantages and disadvantages of using Essential Habitat as a regulatory tool for protecting black racers? Should we consider this tool given the concerns expressed above and its success with bald eagles?
- 9. Is it more difficult to designate Essential Habitat for a <u>generalist</u> species?
- 10. I would recommend that key biological information is collected by the Department <u>before</u> designating habitat protection areas (e.g. Essential Habitat).
- 11. How much funding is available to the Department to answer some of the key biological questions?
- 12. Consider including Maine Municipal Association (MMA) as an important Department constituent for all public meetings involving BwH, species mapping, or regulations.
- 13. There is a need for adequate funding to help attain the management goals and objectives for the black racer.
