Short & Long Term Focus – Jennifer Reck (NASHP)	 Information contained in written reports; highlights and discussion noted below: Short-Term: Waste free formularies: eliminating wasteful drugs from plan formularies, reverse auctions: to negotiate higher value contracts with PBMs & monitor performance, and negotiating specific rebate amounts for drugs causing plan spend to exceed spending targets Long Term: Establishing a common formulary for all public payors, implement 100% transparent, pass-through contracts with PBM's for lowest net cost, and changing formularies when sufficient rebates cannot be secured 	Anne Woloson mentioned asking someone from the Massachusetts Healthcare Cost Commission to speak about what has worked with their prescription drug initiatives.
