Plan Design Committee Update – <i>Amy Deschaines</i>	Information contained in written reports; highlights and discussion noted below: Recommendations: Implement pilot program with Carrum 2.6% increase on working rates Implement premium holiday Carrum Health – Required Benefit Pilot Program (Hip/Knee Replacements): Carrum delivers significant cost savings across procedure types (40% lower for hip/knee replacements) Average savings per joint replacement surgery - \$16,861. 	procedures that would have been part of this Spectrum required benefit. Spectrum locations: Portland and Auburn. Members that are more than 150 miles from Portland or Auburn would be granted exceptions to use the health plan benefit (currently ~98% of members within 150 miles). Example Exception Criteria: 3-Month Grace Period Medical unsafe to travel (per clinical documentation) Caregiver obligations (e.g., child or elderly family member) Inability to secure an adult travel companion Surgery performed in an emergency Revision procedure unable to be serviced by Carrum Assumed Plan Design/Program Changes for 7/1/2022 MH/SA office visits covered at 100% both INN and OON (balance billing OON) Coverage for maintenance chiropractic visits Implementing Hinge Health Hip/Knee joint replacements required to flow through Carrum (3-month grace period and exceptions) Increase working rates by 2.6% and implement 3-month premium holiday (with the option to extend another month upon future evaluation)
