ORGI CODE: The report is sorted on this code. Please make sure that all employees are shown in the correct ORGI. This is crucial to the EEO report, as it determines the reporting group for each employee. You may wish to review ORG2, ORG3 and ORG4 codes as well.

SEX CODE: F = Female

M = Male

RACE: 0 = White

1 = Black

2 = Hispanic 3 = Asian

4 = American Indian

5 = Not coded

Also attached is a narrative of the names of each of the ORG1 codes. Please make sure this list is complete and the narrative correctly describes the ORG1. Please return this corrected list to Jeannie Johnson before 5:00 p.m. on March 30, 1990.
