INTRODUCTION

On August 31-September 1, 2011, the Maine State Board of Nursing ("Board") met at the Board's office located at 161 Capitol Street, Augusta, Maine. The Board reviewed the criminal matter of State of Maine vs. Jane R. Curtis regarding recent criminal convictions in the Cumberland County Superior Court, Portland, Maine (UCD Docket No. CR-2010-5394). The Judgment and Commitment dated February 28, 2011 and Conditions of Probation are attached hereto, incorporated herein and marked as Exhibit A.

FACTS

- Jane R. Curtis has been licensed as a registered professional nurse to practice in Maine since November 23, 2009.
- 2. On February 28, 2011, Jane R. Curtis ("Ms. Curtis") entered a plea of Guilty to the following four criminal charges in an Indictment dated August 8, 2010:
 - Count 1 Acquiring Drugs by Deception, Class C felony. On or about January 21, 2010, in the County of Cumberland, State of Maine, Jane R. Curtis, as a result of deception, did obtain or exercise control over a prescription for a scheduled drug, Oxycodone, which was in fact a schedule W drug, (17-A M.R.S. § 1102(1)(I)), all in violation of 17-A M.R.S. §1108(1)(A) (2006 & Supp. 2009);
 - Count III Acquiring Drugs by Deception, Class D misdemeanor. On or about January 14, 2010, in the County of Cumberland, State of Maine, Jane R. Curtis, as a result of deception, did obtain or exercise control over a prescription for a scheduled drug, Neurontin, also known as Gabapentin, which was in fact a schedule Z drug, (17-A M.R.S. § 1102(4)(A)), all in violation of 17-A M.R.S. §1108(1)(D) (2006 & Supp. 2009);
 - Count IV Acquiring Drugs by Deception, Class D misdemeanor. On or about January 21, 2010, in the County of Cumberland, State of Maine, Jane R. Curtis, as a result of deception, did obtain or exercise control over a prescription for a scheduled drug, Neurontin, also known as Gabapentin, which was in fact a schedule Z drug, (17-A M.R.S. § 1102(4)(A)), all in violation of 17-A M.R.S. §1108(1)(D) (2006 & Supp. 2009); and,
 - Count VIII Forgery, Class D misdemeanor. On or about January 26, 2010, in the County of Cumberland, State of Maine, Jane R. Curtis did commit forgery, in that, with the intent to defraud or deceive another person or government, namely CVS Pharmacy, she did falsely complete or alter a written instrument, or knowingly utter or possess such an instrument, to wit: a medical drug prescription form dated January 26, 2010 for Oxycodone, a copy of which instrument is attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated in this Count by reference, all in violation of 17-A M.R.S. § 703(1)(A) (2006 & Supp. 2009).



Jane R. Curtis received a sentence of three (3) years incarceration with all but 30 days suspended; two (2) years probation; and a fine of \$1,200. The Temporary Record of Submission Judgment or Conviction Report Number 5500000067435972 and a Case Synopsis from the Attorney General Health Care Crimes Unit of the State of Maine dated August 18, 2010 are attached hereto, incorporated herein and marked as Exhibit C.

3. On February 17, 2010, the Board received a Provider Report from Martin's Point Health Care ("Martin's Point") pursuant to 24 M.R.S. § 2506, and on the basis of the Provider Report, the Board issued a Complaint against Ms. Curtis on February 23, 2010. Ms. Curtis was employed at Martin's Point from January 4, 2010 to February 9, 2010. The Provider Report states that while Ms. Curtis was employed at Martin's Point as a registered professional nurse, she assumed the identity of a patient at Martin's Point in order to obtain prescription medication (Oxycodone and Neurontin) under that patient's name. She later presented a false prescription to a CVS Pharmacy, assuming the same patient's identity, and deceitfully obtained Oxycodone. In addition, she inappropriately removed blank prescription sheets from Martin's Point and forged a script prescribing Oxycodone for herself, further forging a practitioner name at Martin's Point. Ms. Curtis admitted to the illegal conduct at Martin's Point and her employment was terminated on February 9, 2010. Exhibit B.

On March 29, 2010, the Board sent Ms. Curtis a "Second Request" for a response to the Board's Complain dated February 23, 2010, with a time limit of April 12, 2010. On April 15, 2010, the Board issued a second Complaint against her as a result of her failure to respond to the Board's Complaint pursuant 32 M.R.S. § 2105-A (1-A).

The Complaint and Provider Report, Second Request and Complaint for Failure to Respond are attached hereto, incorporated herein and marked as Exhibit D.

- 4. On September 2, 2010, the Board voted to suspend Jane R. Curtis's registered professional nursing license effective immediately, pursuant to 5 M.R.S. § 1004(3), based upon the immediate jeopardy her continued practice as a registered professional nurse posed to the health and safety of the public. A hearing on this matter before the Board, scheduled for November 5, 2010, was continued at the request of Ms. Curtis's attorney, with the agreement that Ms. Curtis's registered professional nursing license would remain suspended until the matter could be resolved. The Notice of Suspension, Notice of Hearing and Continuance are attached hereto, incorporated herein and marked as Exhibit E.
- 5. On September 28, 2010, the Board received information that Jane R. Curtis was convicted April 21, 2010 in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts of five counts of Attempting To Commit a Crime (Breaking and Entering, felony) and Possession of a Burglarious Instrument. The Criminal Docket information from the Trial Court of Massachusetts District Court Department, Docket Number 0952CR001177 is attached hereto, incorporated herein and Marked as Exhibit F.
- 6. As a registered professional nurse, Jane R. Curtis is responsible for handling and administering medications and scheduled drugs to patients. 32 M.R.S. § 2102.

APPLICABLE LAW

- 7. Pursuant to 32 M.R.S. § 2105-A (2), "The Board may suspend or revoke a license pursuant to Title 5, section 10004."
- 8. Pursuant to 5 M.R.S. § 10004(1), "...an agency may revoke, suspend or refuse to renew any license without proceedings in conformity with subchapters IV or VI, when:[t]he decision to take that action rests solely upon a finding or conviction in court of any violation which by statute is expressly made grounds for revocation."
- 9. Pursuant to 32 M.R.S. § 2105-A (2) (G), the Board may suspend or revoke an individual's nurse license when the grounds for discipline is a "conviction of a crime that involves dishonesty or false statement or

that relates directly to the practice for which the licensee is licensed or conviction of a crime for which incarceration for one year or more may be imposed."

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Board has the authority to suspend or revoke Jane R. Curtis's registered professional nurse license pursuant to 5 M.R.S. § 10004 (1) and 32 M.R.S. § 2105-A (2) (G). The criminal convictions on February 28, 2011 described in Paragraph No. 2 are grounds for discipline because Ms. Curtis was convicted of crimes that involve dishonesty and the crimes relate directly to the licensed practice of registered professional nursing. In addition, the Count VIII Forgery conviction described in Paragraph No. 2 is a criminal conviction for which incarceration for one year or more may be imposed.

In addition, the Board concluded, based upon the recent convictions and serious nature of the underlying criminal conduct, that Ms. Curtis's behavior fails to conform to legal standards and accepted standards of the nursing profession, and the conviction of crimes in the State of Maine are substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a registered professional nurse and that such conduct reflects adversely on the health and welfare of the public.

DECISION AND ORDER

A motion was made and seconded to immediately revoke Jane R. Curtis's registered professional nurse license pursuant to 5 M.R.S. § 10004 (1) and 32 M.R.S. § 2105-A (2) (G). By a unanimous vote of the Board, Jane R. Curtis's registered professional nurse license is revoked.

Enclosed please find court documents in the above referenced case for review and consideration for federal exclusion. On February 28, 2011, Jane R. Curtis, pleaded guilty to one count of Acquiring Drugs by Deception (Class C), two counts Acquiring Drugs by Deception (Class D), and one count of Forgery (Class D). The offenses occurred on or about January 14, 2010 to January 28, 2010. The case was investigated by MDEA Agent Jeffrey Viola and Healthcare Crimes Unit (HCU) Detective James Gioia, and prosecuted by the HCU.

The Court imposed two years imprisonment, all but 30 days suspended, two years probation with conditions, and a \$400.00 fine on the felony level Acquiring Drugs by Deception. Concurrent sentences of 30 days imprisonment were imposed on the remaining counts, and a total of \$800.00 in additional fines.

While employed by Martin's Point Health Care Jane Curtis RN is alleged to have obtained drugs by calling in and forging prescriptions at several pharmacies including CVS, Hannaford and a CVS in Massachusetts.

This incident was initially reported to the Portland Police Department and Maine Drug Enforcement Agency and eventually transferred to this office on 05/24/10 at which time I was assigned to complete follow-up prior to any prosecution. My follow-up entailed collecting police reports, records from Martin's Point Health Care, CVS Pharmacy in Portland and Hannaford Pharmacy in Portland. I was also tasked with conducting brief interviews of the involved Pharmacists and several Martin's Point employees.

- \$11.4 for an Gabapentin Prescription on 1/04/10 for Jaime Brown
- \$2.77 for an Oxycodone Prescription on 1/21/10 for Jaime Brown
- \$13.70 for an Gabapentin Prescription on 1/21/10 for Maria Fowler

- C. On 01-16-2010 there was a request from the same patient to transfer the prescription to a CVS pharmacy in Cambridge, Massachusetts, and that pharmacy filled another 90 day prescription for Neurontin.
- D. On 01-28-2010 the same patient requested that the prescription be transferred back from to the Hannaford at 295 Forest Avenue in Portland, and another 90-day prescription for Neurontin was filled.
- E. On 01-21-2010 the CVS pharmacy at 449 Forest Avenue filled a prescription for Oxycodone to a patient, Jane Doe. This prescription also had the forged signature of DR. CONNOLLY.
- 5) LEEMAN then called the patient JANE DOE and learned that the prescriptions in her name were not any medication that she was prescribed and she was not a patient of DR. CONNOLLYS.
- LEEMAN then checked what TRAIN calls the "Refill Protocol" of Martins Point Health Care records system. LEEMAN told TRAIN that she learned that a Registered Nurse named JANE CURTIS had filled two 90-day prescription refills of Neurontin for the JANE DOE patient on 01-14-2010. TRAIN states that Martins Point Health Care records show that those transactions were authorized by Nurse Practitioner JAIME ROCHE. TRAIN states that there was no signature on those authorizations and ROCHE confirmed that she did not authorize those prescriptions.
- 7) LEEMAN also told TRAIN that she discovered that CURTIS had missed work on 02-01-2010. TRAIN said that CURTIS called and left a message that she had been in a car accident and was in a Cambridge, Massachusetts hospital.
- 8) TRAIN then called the CVS pharmacy at 449 Forest Avenue in Portland, Maine and spoke to a pharmacist. TRAIN learned that there was, at the time, video footage of a female picking up a prescription of Oxycodone. TRAIN then went to that CVS store and viewed the video tape and learned that the woman on the tape appeared to be JANE CURTIS. TRAIN stated to Officer BLISS that the woman that she identified as JANE CURTIS was wearing a coat with large loop buttons on the front. TRAIN also confirmed with LEEMAN that CURTIS wears the same style of coat.
- 9) TRAIN told BLISS that she called CURTIS on 02-02-2010 and confronted her with what she had learned. CURTIS at denied having any involvement, but on 02-11-2010 CURTIS



Pursuant to 5 M.R.S.A. § 5302 (1): "Licensing agencies may refuse to grant or renew, or may suspend, revoke or take other disciplinary action against any occupational license, registration or permit on the basis of the criminal history record information relating to convictions denominated in section 5301, subsection 2, but only if the licensing agency determines that the applicant, licensee, registrant or permit holder so convicted has not been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust. The applicant, licensee, registrant or permit holder shall bear the burden of proof that there exists sufficient rehabilitation to warrant the public trust."

The hearing will be held in accordance with applicable provisions of the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, 5 M.R.S.A. Section 9051 and 9064. You have the right to be represented by an attorney. You may present evidence, call witnesses and present oral or written testimony and arguments to the Board. Applications for intervention pursuant to 5 M.R.S.A. Section 9054 will be accepted until the commencement of the hearing.

Failure to appear at the scheduled hearing may result in a disposition by default. Any such default may be set aside for good cause shown and information obtained during the hearing may be used in subsequent legal proceedings. Violations of the above-cited statutory and regulatory provisions may result in sanctions ranging from a letter of guidance or concern to suspension or revocation of your license. A fine of up to \$1,500 for each violation may be imposed. Also, please be advised that pursuant to 10 M.R.S.A. Section 8003-D, if there is a finding of violation, the Board may assess actual expenses of investigation and hearing in addition to other penalties provided by law. Such expenses include, but are not limited to, travel expenses and the proportionate part of the salaries and other expenses of investigators and/or inspectors; hourly costs of hearing officers; costs associated with record retrieval; and the costs of transcribing or reproducing the administrative record.



Jane Revere Curtis of Cambridge was arrested after she was observed by two witnesses attempting to break into 5 residences. At one residence she was seen with a black object in her hand attempting to pry the door open. She was subsequently stopped across the street where she stated that she was going to a job interview. Moments later the witness was able to supply photos of the attempted break and when Curtis was unable to corroborate her reason for being there she was placed under arrest for Attempted B&E and Possession of a Burglarious Tool.

On May 18, 2009 at approximately 10:20am I Officer Sousa while working 3R was dispatched (along with Car 3 and Car 18) to 402 Broadway for a break in progress. ECC stated that the reporting person observed a white female attempting to get into several doors. Upon receiving this transmission I was one block away and arrived on scene within one minute. While arriving on scene there was no one in front of 402 Broadway. ECC then updated responding units that the female was now on the opposite side of the street and described her as a white female, blonde hair, wearing blue jeans and brown jacket. Upon hearing this description I observed this female coming out of the walkway that leads to 395 Broadway (which is opposite of 402 Broadway). The suspect was walking on Broadway towards Crawford St when I approached her and asked her to stop. She was identified as Jane Curtis. I then informed Curtis that someone fitting her description was seen trying to enter several doors in the area. At this time Car 3 Officers Rivera and Ivey, S Unit DiNatale and LaMonica and Det. Mui and Car 18 Sgt Sennott arrived on scene.

Curtis stated that she was a nurse and was going to a job interview on Merrill St but forgot the exact address of where she was suppose to go. She then pointed to a white house on the corner of Broadway and Merrill and stated she thought that was the house she was suppose to go to for the interview. Note the house she pointed to has an address of 402 Broadway Curtis then stated several times that was the only house she went to, and that she came across the street to 395 Broadway to look at mail boxes to see if she could find the employer. Curtis further stated that she got the interview through and ad on Craigs List and that she had a printed copy of the ad at her residence at 1 Crawford St which is one block away. She then invited us to her house to look at the ad. Officers LaMonica and DiNatale along with Det Mui went with Curtis to verify.

While the Officers were verifying the ad, I along with Sgt Sennott spoke the reporting person Jonathan Santos. Santos immediately showed us photos that he took of Curtis standing in front of the doorway 404 Broadway. Note that Curtis stated that she only went to 402 Broadway. Santos then stated she was acting very suspicious, always looking behind her back. Santos also stated that he observed Curtis with an object in her hand holding it against the door. We were unable to see this object in the photos due to them being too small on the camera. Santos stated that he would print us out copies at his residence.

I then responded to Curtis' residence at 1 Crawford St. When I arrived Curtis was on her laptop looking for the ad. She stated she could not find the original e-mail. She did not have a printed out copy as she had stated earlier. Curtis then stated the person she was going to meet was Alisson Tompkins who was wheel chair bound and needed a home nurse. Curtis said that Tompkins told her in the e-mail that she lived at 402 Merrill St. Note that the highest numbered house on Merrill St is 12. Through a check of the registered voters on Merrill St (current as of 2006) reveals no one by the name of Allison Tompkins. A pat frisk of Curtis revealed a set of keys, black hairbrush and a cell phone. All were placed on the kitchen table. I was then contacted by Det. Clavette and was asked to respond to 402 Broadway to speak with a person.

Officer LaMonica and I then responded to 402 Broadway and spoke with the resident Kevin Branley who is a Detective with Cambridge Police. Branley was off duty at the time, but informed me that Santos approached him showing incriminating photos of Curtis. I then responded to the Santos residence at 401 Broadway #26 to speak with him. Santos was able to show me bigger photos that he took of Curtis. I observed the following: Several photos show that Curtis was standing in front of the doorway of 404B Broadway a. Several photos show Curtis standing in front of doorway to 404A Broadway with a black object in her hand and holding it against the door as if she were trying to pry it open. Several more photos of Curtis standing in front of the doorways of 402 Broadway APT # 1 and # 3.And another photo of Curtis crossing the street walking towards 395 Broadway (the location where I observed her leaving).

I then spoke with the Santos' room mate Marrika Trotter. Trotter stated that her | and Santos were both in their apartment admiring Santos' new camera. Trotter than observed (through a window) a white female standing in front of the doorway to 404A Broadway acting very suspicious, always looking behind her back. Trotter then observed this female with a black object in her hand banging it as if she were trying to pry open the door. At this time, she notified the police while Santos was taking photos as it was occurring. Trotter then saw the same female walk over to 404 Broadway (next door) and observed her trying to open the door with a key. Trotter stated she did the same for 404B Broadway and again for both apartments at 402 Broadway. Trotter then observed the female cross the street towards 395 Broadway.

A this time I notified Officer DiNatale and Det Mui who were still with Curtis to place her under arrest. After Curtis was placed in the wagon we began a search of the immediate area for the black object that was seen in the photos. The search came up unsuccessful and Det Mui and I responded back to 401 Broadway copies of the photos for evidence. After looking at the photos once more Det Mui and I believe the black object that was used in the attempted break to be the black hairbrush that was in Curtis' possession at her residence. was informed by Det Clavette that she might have been using a "Bump Key" which Det Clavette described as a sort of master key which fits most locks. After the "Bump Key" is inserted in the lock, the user will usually hammer on the key with an object to pop the lock out. Both the hairbrush and key was not retrieved as evidence as their significance became known to us after the arrest

Santos supplied us with a disc of the photos. The disc was brought back to the station to have the photos printed. Both the disc and 36 photos were properly tagged as evidence.

Being as the victims were not home at the time of this incident I am not able to completely verify the names, phone numbers or any other information.
