INTRODUCTION

On October 1, 2003 Jane B. Jack ("Licensee") met with the Maine State Board of Nursing ("Board") and the Office of the Attorney General, State of Maine. The parties discussed a complaint from the State of Maine Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Office of Licensing and Registration, Complaints & Enforcement Division dated June 12, 2003 and attached hereto as Exhibit A. On the basis of the facts substantiated in the above complaint and admissions of the Licensee the Board has determined that Ms. Jack is in violation of her Consent Agreement dated October 26, 1999, attached hereto as Exhibit B.

FACTS

1. Jane B. Jack has been licensed as a registered professional nurse since 1976.
2. Jane B. Jack admits that on six separate occasions between January 10, 2003 and June 10, 2003, she misappropriated prescription medications (Tramadol) for her own use from the Rite Aide pharmacy. Exhibit A.

ORDER

The Board finds that Jane B. Jack has failed to comply with the terms of the Consent Agreement dated October 26, 1999, and pursuant to 32 M.R.S.A. § 2105-A(1-A), 10 M.R.S.A. § 8003(5) and the terms of the Consent Agreement, Paragraph No. 8, ORDERS that Ms. Jack's license as a registered professional nurse be suspended for a minimum period of one year commencing retroactively from October 1, 2003.

Jane B. Jack's license will not be reinstated until and unless the Board, upon Ms. Jack's request, votes to reinstate Ms. Jack's license and the Board is satisfied that Ms. Jack's license reinstatement is consistent with the public health and welfare in the area of nursing practice. Following the one year of suspension, if Ms. Jack is reinstated, Ms. Jack's license to practice professional nursing shall be subject to a period of probation of nursing practice.
