AUTHORIZER INFORMATION

The Maine Charter School Commission (Commission or MCSC) currently oversees nine charter schools serving approximately 2200 students, a little more than one percent of all k-12 students in Maine. In September 2011, Maine became the 41st state to pass public charter school legislation and the Commission's first two charter schools opened in 2012. Two types of entities are permitted to authorize public charter schools in Maine. The Maine Charter School Commission may authorize up to 10 public charter schools throughout the state during the first 10 years of Maine's charter school legislation. Additionally, local school boards and collaboratives of local school boards may authorize charter schools within their school administrative units at any time with no limit to the number of charter schools they may authorize. No local school boards currently authorize charter schools in Maine.

The Maine Charter School Commission consists of seven members appointed by the State Board of Education for three-year terms. Three members must be members of the State Board of Education, and they nominate the other four members from the public at large, who must be approved by a majority vote of the State Board of Education.






Charter School Enrollment by Year




















Map of Maine's Public Charter Schools - 2016-2017

ACADIA Academy






Baxter Academy for Technology and Science



The school's mission is to be a rigorous, college preparatory high school promoting student ownership of learning through a curriculum focused specifically on science, technology, engineering, and math. Its vision is to use a technology-rich, project-based learning approach to education at the secondary level.

Cornville Regional Charter School




Cornville Regional Charter School was the first elementary public charter school in the state of Maine. Located in Cornville and Skowhegan, it opened its doors on October 1, 2012, to students in grades K-6. Currently, the school educates students in grades

doors on October 1, 2012, to students in grades K-6. Currently, the school educates students in grades preK through 9 from six Maine school districts from St. Albans to Fairfield and points in between. In 2016,

with its 5-year renewal, Cornville Regional Charter School was approved to open a Pre-K and a high school, both to open in Skowhegan for the 2017-18 school year.

The school's mission is to create a safe, respectful, nurturing and active learning community where every child is given the opportunity to thrive academically, to be accepted, to celebrate accomplishments and to develop a lifetime love of learning.

Fiddlehead School of Arts & Sciences






the Reggio Emilia learning approach (image of the child, children's relationship and interactions within a system, role of the families, role of space, and teacher and children as partners in learning).


Harpswell Coastal Academy




Maine Academy of Natural Sciences


Maine Academy of Natural Sciences (MeANS), located in Hinckley, opened in September 2011, and was the first Maine high school to focus on the natural sciences.


Snow Pond Arts Academy



AUTHORIZER OPERATING COSTS

By law, the Commission is allowed to receive up to 3% of annual per-pupil allocations received by each public charter school it authorizes. These funds must be used to cover the costs for the Commission to oversee its public charter schools. In November 2016, MCSC voted to take only 2.25% of annual per-pupil allocations received by each public charter school it authorizes. In addition, the MCSC returned funds to each school totaling \$428,000.

The revenue received from the Department of Education based on the Essential Program S (EPS) formula in FY 17 was \$581,538.57 of which \$304,007 was used to pay the Commission per diem, fund professional development for the Commission and staff, engage professional and administrative staff, and to fund activities to oversee public charter schools. The balance has been carried into FY 2018.
