

Maine Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) Income Guidelines

CSFP applicants are income-eligible if they participate in any of these five federal programs:

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
Medicare Savings Programs (MSP)
The Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR)
The Low-Income Subsidy Program (LIS)
Supplemental Security Income (SSI)

Verbal attestation of participation in any of the 5 programs above is considered sufficient proof of income.

Alternatively, applicants not participating in any of the above programs may use the following thresholds to determine their income eligibility for CSFP in Maine.

Updated January 21, 2026. This table indicates 150% of the federal poverty line.

CSFP applicants must be at least 60 years of age at some point during the month they receive a food package.
