Plan your path into farming in Maine.

What course do you start with? How much experience do you have?

## **No Farming Experience**



### **Business Planning for Producers**

- 10-session business planning course
- Open to anyone currently operating a land or sea-based business or planning to start one in the next year in Maine

## 1 or More Years of Farming Experience



### **Farm Beginnings**

- Series of intensive workshops will help you to develop a whole farm plan
- Open to any farm looking to apply whole farm planning and financial management tools to their operation – you must have 1 year of sales records

## 2 or More Years of Farming Experience



### **Journeyperson Program**

- Hands-on Farm Training Program
- Open to established farm businesses with secure land tenure and will use this program as a tangible step toward achieving their farm goals.



### **Maine Farms for the Future**

- a competitive grant program that provides selected farms with business planning assistance and investment support.
- Open to farms that have been producing agricultural products commercially in the State of Maine for at least two years.

## 3 or More Years of Farming Experience



#### **Business of Farming**

- Year-long business planning course
- Open to experienced farmers who want to analyze their current business model and use the information for decision-making.
  - Consists of winter workshops, 20 hours of business planning assistance, and \$500 seed grant upon completion of program.
