MAINE STATE HARNESS RACING COMMISSION DECISION AND ORDER IN RE: DR. DENNIS FOSS

Based on the evidence reviewed by the Commission at the appeal hearing held on January 25, 2021 the Commission adopts the following Findings of Fact as follows:

- 1. Appellant Foss alleges that the horse named Empire Earl N went inside the pylons during the seventh race of a race at First Track Cumberland on October 2, 2021.
- 2. The judges at the track reviewed the race and concluded that Empire Earl N did not go within the pylons. As a result of their finding, they did not place the horse.
- 3. Appellant filed a written appeal on October 4, 2021.
- 4. A review of the race video indicates that the of the the judges was proper.

Based on these Findings of Fact, the Commission concludes that the Appellant has not proven, by a preponderance of the evidence, that a violation did occur.

Therefore, as a matter of law, the APPEAL is DENIED.
