# 2023 Woodland Resource Action Plans – WoodsWise East

**Additional specifications:** WRAPs receiving additional funding under the WoodsWise East program must include additional information describing habitat conditions. <u>These must be in a stand-alone section marked</u> "WoodsWise East".

- <u>A.</u> <u>Bird Habitat description(s):</u> A paragraph describing/summarizing <u>overall</u> forest composition and structure, and the presence/absence of the following habitat features\*:
  - Early and/or late successional stands
  - Canopy layers: Overstory Midstory Understory
  - Dominant species, % Cover, Gaps

## Recommended:

- Snags, Cavity/Decay Trees
- Down Coarse Woody Material, Fine Woody Material
- Invasive Plants
- Incorporating habitat into stand prescriptions/recommendations

### B. Brook trout habitat:

- Show streams on the stand map or a separate map
- o Include a paragraph describing stream habitats
  - Streams present on the property
  - Identify if crossings/other structures are barriers to aquatic organism passage
  - Overall riparian forest conditions
  - o Recommended: Incorporating habitat into stand prescriptions/recommendations

NOTE: many of these items are already required in WRAP specifications and can be summarized, but the above paragraphs should stand alone. Habitat information can also be incorporated into stand prescriptions & project recommendations in line with the landowner's objectives.

**WRAP amendments** (e.g. for habitat assessment, silvicultural operations plan, upgrade to CAP-106 or TF standard) should append the above information onto the existing plan. If incorporated into the plan, it must be clearly identified and easy to find.
