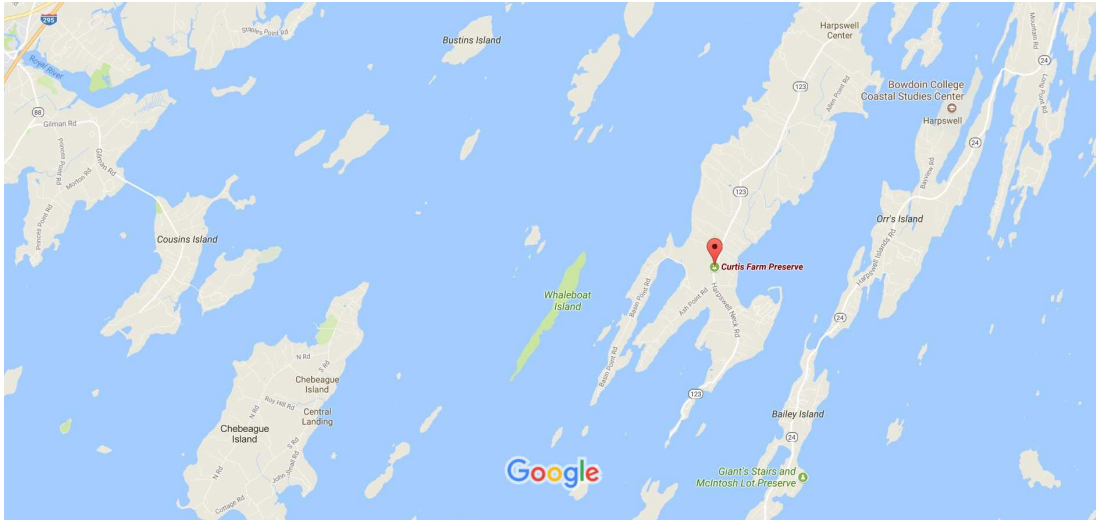




COASTAL COMMUNITY GRANTS: Coastal Habitat Restoration

Town of Harpswell Preparing for Coastal Flooding: A Plan for Basin Point Road and its wetlands

PROJECT DESCRIPTION (completed December 2018)

Funds from this grant were utilized to develop a long-term plan for managing the potential impacts of flooding due to sea level rise and storm surge on a key road and culvert in an important habitat area on Basin Point Road in the Town of Harpswell. The Town's engineering consultant, Gorrill Palmer was retained to develop conceptual road and culvert improvement designs to accommodate sea level rise, order of magnitude cost estimates for design alternatives and prepare a conceptual design report working in tandem with Casco Bay Estuary Partnership.

The Casco Bay Estuary Partnership (CBEP) was retained to prepare an Ecological Impact Study to assess the impact of sea level rise on the ecology of the tidal wetland and pond of the Curtis Farm Preserve located adjacent to the project area.
