#### 1. Approach

#### a. Describe specific activities and accomplishments...

For the 2012-2013 funding year, ME FPOSP is concentrating its efforts on training individuals in more remote and underserved areas of the state, e.g. Aroostook and Washington counties. We continue to reach out to school groups and provide resources and training to educators when requested. We made efforts to promote National Invasive Species Awareness Week by scheduling outreach events and trainings that week, as well as writing a press release. Details of accomplishments below...

- i. <u>Tie in to National Invasive Species Awareness Week (NISAW; March 3-8, 2013)</u>
  - Wrote a press release (**attachment 1**) that was also made available on the <u>Maine Invasive</u> <u>Species Network (MISN) website</u>.
  - Provided a TTT training in Presque Isle during that week.
  - Provided FPOSP tabling at the 14<sup>th</sup> Annual Maine Milfoil Summit, and the Portland Flower Show.
  - Gave presentations on invasive forest pests at the MELNA workshop, the Arborists Association annual meeting, a state park's education day, etc.
  - Promoted the newly finished mini-documentary we produced with the previous year's grant <u>"Foes of the Forests: Maine's Trees at Risk from Invasive Insects".</u>
- ii. Conduct TTT sessions
  - By the end of the midyear reporting period (March 30, 2013), we provided one half-day TTT session to a remote area of the state Presque Isle (Aroostook County). Turnout was excellent (33). Three more TTTs were planned and will be conducted by the end of June.
- iii. Reach out to Educators and active community members
  - Last year's TTT sessions yielded some active young educators who developed their own presentations and provided outreach to K-6 school groups and classrooms. FPOSP provided technical assistance, outreach materials, and incentive items to the volunteers.
  - Gave talks to retirement communities, Lion's club, forestry students, etc.
- iv. Tabling at various events
  - Conservation fairs, agricultural fairs, trades shows, etc.
- v. Social media outreach
  - Maintain the <u>Maine Bug Watch facebook page</u> 92 posts made during the reporting period. Currently have 108 "friends".
  - Volunteer network promotes invasive forest pest info on their webpages and facebook pages (e.g. <u>Saco River Recreational Council</u>).

National Invasive Species Awareness Week (NISAW), now in its fourth year, is an awareness week that will be marked by national, state and local events, including a major conference in Washington D.C., a public meeting by the National Invasive Species Council, Capitol Hill briefings on aquatic invasive species, and updates by federal agencies on important invasive species issues and initiatives. While the State of Maine is not recognizing the week formally, a number of activities related to invasive species and available to the public are taking place during the week. Here are 8 events and activities to observe NISAW in Maine:

- The 14<sup>th</sup> Annual Maine Milfoil Summit will be held on Friday, March 1, at the Lewiston-Auburn campus of the University of Southern Maine, from 8:30 a.m. to noon. - Maine Landscape and Nursery Association Certification Workshop, March 4, Portland; Department staff will be presenting on browntail moth, winter moth, and other tree pest problems.
- 3. "Foes of the Forests: Maine's Trees at Risk from Invasive Insects" is a new documentary highlighting the threats from invasive forest pests on the state's forest related industries and natural resources. Featured insects are the emerald ash borer, hemlock woolly adelgid, and

- Maine Conservation Corps Trail Training program, March 8, Wolfe's Neck Woods State Park; Maine Conservation Corps and Bureau of Parks and Lands; tree I.D. and Invasive Insects education day.
- Invasive Forest Insect Outreach Volunteer Training; Friday, March 8, 12:00 4:30 PM, University of Maine-Presque Isle; Department staff will train people to recognize, report and to spread awareness about the Asian longhorned beetle (ALB), the emerald ash borer (EAB), brown spruce longhorned beetle (BSLB) and hemlock woolly adelgid (HWA).
