<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mark Cooper – Maine State Representative, Windham, ME 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Opposes the Board’s proposal to add the four SGARs to Ch. 40. SGARs are in use because they act at low dosages and are effective at controlling target pests. The effectiveness and speed reduce the amount of material needed to control rodents. Rodenticides are not labeled for use for chipmunks or squirrels, label violations have increased since the 132nd legislature passed LD 1697 to increase penalties. Maine DACF, DHHS, and CDC requires that businesses have rodent control measures in place and many establishments must be inspected, insured, and licensed. Asks the questions: what effective alternatives are in place to replace these 4 SGARs? Feels that the benefits of using these materials outweigh the 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Board thanks Rep. Cooper for their comments. The Board is aware that these materials were created when the First Generation Anticoagulant Rodenticides (FGARS) were found to be less effective and pests were becoming resistant to them. While there are no SGARs labelled for use for chipmunks and squirrels, there are other pelleted baits that are non-anticoagulant rodenticides that are labelled for these pests. Applications of SGARs to control these two species would be considered off-label use and would constitute a pesticide label violation. Some Maine agencies do require licensure and rodent control measures in order to operate. In Maine, application of pesticides commercially to businesses and food establishments for hire also requires a Master Applicator/Commercial Operator license. Alternatives to rodenticides include Integrated Pest Management (IPM) tactics that do not use chemicals, such as mechanical traps, devices, exclusion,

There are also other forms of rodenticides, including First-Generation Anticoagulant Rodenticides (FGARs) and Non-Anticoagulant Rodenticides. These are not currently considered restricted-use, but may vary in their effectiveness.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Board is aware of the need for these products, but is proposing these restrictions because of the risks they pose on the general consumer market. • Classifying SGARs as restricted-use pesticides means that they can only be purchased and used by certified/licensed pesticide applicators and may only be sold by licensed restricted-use pesticide dealers.

Classifying as restricted use ensures that members can continue to access these materials. • If these products were not available to licensed 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Board thanks NEPMA for its comments. • The Board agrees that rodenticides are a tool to help manage rodents. In previous Board discussions, access for applicators was a big concern. • All licensed applicators should be utilizing more than just rodenticides in their rodent control programs. While SGARs can be a tool for applicators to use, other means such as exclusion, sanitation, and trapping should also be tactics that pest management professionals (PCP) use as part of their IPM program. IPM also discourages the routine application of materials and requires

Described the primary and secondary effects of rodenticide poisonings, including downstream bioaccumulation, and cited studies that confirm the harmful effects of rodenticides on wildlife. Would like the Board to do more, including working on SGARs that are available on the online market and prohibiting the online sales loopholes. Created a petition related to the proposed rulemaking on SGARs that ~2,700 residents signed. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Board thanks Maine Audubon for its comments. When there are sales of unauthorized products, including those that are restricted-use or “consumer-sized” products that are not to be sold on the residential consumer market, BPC would investigate those instances as it is made aware of them. If Maine Audubon or any party is aware of the sale of unauthorized pesticides online, they can make a complaint to Board staff by phone 207-287-2731 or email pesticides@maine.gov. The Board appreciates the public outreach that Maine Audubon put into these rule changes.

Many consumers do not read the label and spread the green blocks around the garage or behind the stove. • Discussed how they were able to purchase large quantities of rodenticide pellets that are banned by EPA. Displayed various sized bags of rodenticide products during the in-person comment period. • Questioned the enforcement of the distribution of rodenticide products that are in large quantities in Maine. Do EPA's regulations for these banned materials apply to Maine? 	<p>and BPC's reports. There are other resources that anyone can use to learn more about pesticides, including the National Pesticide Information Center (NPIC), University of Maine Cooperative Extension (UMCE), and BPC's websites.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Board agrees that IPM (non-chemical control methods) for rodents should always be the first option when dealing with rodent problems. However, it is not always practical to only rely on one method of rodent control. While snap traps are a good option for management, other means of IPM like exclusion, sanitation, and population control are also viable means. However, in some larger infestations, these methods might not always achieve the desired result. Only relying on a method like snap traps can create additional carcass retrieval that could attract other unwanted pests if not properly maintained. • The Board agrees that education can always be improved. The Board will take additional education requests into consideration as it reviews public comments as they relate to the proposed rulemaking amendments. • BPC staff are reviewing the products mentioned at the public hearing to determine if any are not intended for sale in stores. Often times, hardware stores and agricultural supply stores are allowed to sell the

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recommended using a survey to Maine veterinarians, because every veterinarian they had spoken to had a pet poisoning story. • Would like store owners to sign a document that lists banned substances and certifies that they have completed training. Additionally, making sure online purchases of banned substances cannot be delivered to Maine zip codes would streamline enforcement. • Supports banning SGARs and FGARs from stores and certified professionals as there are better methods of rodent control. Would like to see the original content of LD 356, and ban the outdoor use of rodenticides in residential settings. 	<p>mentioned products. However, the EPA has not completely banned rodenticides in pellet form nationwide. Instead, they have made changes to “consumer size” products available for in-store purchase. As a result, larger quantities of certain rodenticide materials may be available at certain agricultural retailers. EPA describes these changes in a 2008 Risk Mitigation Decision (RMD) for 10 rodenticides:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ All “consumer size” rodenticide bait products must be sold packaged together with a ready-to-use (pre-baited) bait station. ○ Bait stations may be 1) non-refillable (disposable, one-time-use stations), or 2) refillable (sold with bait refills). The total amount of bait that may be contained in a “consumer size” product (including the initial bait placement in the bait station, plus any refills) must not exceed one pound. Bait refills may not be sold individually; they must be sold with at least one bait station. ○ Meal, treated whole-grain, pelleted, and liquid forms of bait (whether packaged in placepacks or not) are prohibited. Bait blocks (and other solid baits that achieve the safety goal, such as paste forms) are the only forms of rodenticide bait that will be approved for use in “consumer size” products.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• BPC Staff reached out to EPA to ask about their website titled “Mouse and rat poisons in pellet form banned”, mentioning that the 2008 RMD does not explicitly ban pellets, as the title implies. EPA acknowledges that the term “ban” can be misunderstood, but that it outlines the restrictions in the 2008 RMD.• BPC enforcement staff will be reviewing the products mentioned, their labels, and if any violations have occurred. BPC will also reach out to hardware stores mentioned in the testimony to see if their software is equipped to handle these product-specific restrictions. EPA’s requirements do apply to Maine, and the BPC has primacy from EPA to enforce regulations. Except for the product labelled “not for sale in hardware stores” that was mentioned during the public hearing, the other products fall within the regulatory guidelines outlined in EPA’s 2008 RMD.• A state-wide survey could be helpful to provide the board with more information

Chapter 34: Certification and Licensing Provisions/Dealers. To obtain the restricted-use dealer licensure, dealers have specific competency standards that must be met by taking an exam.<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Chapter 34, Section 1 states: “No person shall be certified as a pesticide dealer unless that person has demonstrated knowledge of pesticide classifications, formulations, labeling, safety, storage and applicable laws and regulations. Also required shall be knowledge of current methodology and technology for the control of pesticide drift to non-target areas, the proper meteorological conditions for the application of pesticides, and the potential adverse effect of pesticides on plants, animals or humans.”○ These regulations are included as a part of EPA’s cooperative agreement, which standardizes requirements between states and EPA. This training has already been approved by EPA

		<p>since the agreement was updated and accepted in 2023.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Products that are not prohibited for distribution or sale in Maine are often imported via online purchases. Maine has taken steps to enforce these prohibited online purchases, but it is difficult to ensure compliance. EPA and other states have also encountered difficulties enforcing zip code distribution with large box stores and online retailers. The Board will take this comment into consideration as it reviews public comments as they relate to the proposed rulemaking amendments. • As outlined in the BPC Rodenticide Report, the original ask of LD 356 would be difficult to enforce, as label language dictates use types, and use types have a wide variation of what “outdoor residential” means. This requires BPC to create an updated list of products, and for all retailers in Maine to update records to ensure they are complying with the products on the list. The board will consider adding FGARs, commercial applicators, and outdoor uses to the restrictions as it reviews public comments as they relate to the proposed rulemaking amendments.

<p>Ecologist – Camden, ME</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Would like to see a complete phase-out of anticoagulant rodenticides for all outdoor uses, both professional and residential, paired with IPM and Maine’s primary rodent control framework (Maine BPC 2025; Murray et al. 2017; Rattner et al. 2014). • Both FGARs and SGARs accumulate in fatty tissues and have a half-life between 2 – 113 days. This persistence means that rodents remain toxic for weeks to months after ingestion, increasing the secondary poisoning risk. • Describes rodenticide use as a high-risk and low-reward system that harms wildlife and pets. Specifically, increased pesticide use is associated with accelerating bird declines. Cites a body of evidence that backs these claims. • Classifying SGARs as restricted use is the correct response, as these compounds are fat-soluble and are the most poisonous anticoagulants on the market. 	<p>reviews public comments as they relate to the proposed rulemaking amendments. .</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Board has had many discussions around the types of rodenticides, including information that SGAR materials are considered higher risk given their higher dosages, which do not need multiple feedings to work. This is why they have focused on the highest risk products first. The Board included reasoning why it did not add FGAR materials to the restrictions, including economic availability, alternatives, and environmental hazards. Discussions on FGARs and SGARs can be found on the BPC Board meetings webpage. • The Board agrees that there are risks when using SGAR materials, which should be minimized when used in accordance with their labels. EPA has also concluded that, in accordance with the Endangered Species Act, additional restrictions on pesticide labels will be implemented moving forward as chemical reviews are completed. More information about the rodenticide strategy plan can be found on EPA’s website. • While predators are natural IPM, SGAR use is needed when IPM methods fail and FGARs are not sufficient to control rodent populations. The Board does agree that IPM use should be a priority when controlling rodent populations.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cited studies where there were high levels of SGAR contamination found in wildlife, including sublethal effects. Using SGARs does not make sense in terms of IPM as it can kill predators, which are considered natural rodent control. • Rodenticides do not actually fix rodent populations. Cited studies where rodent populations decreased when human density was reduced (COVID-19). Changing entry points, sanitation, and food sources are the only sustainable forms of control. • Cited IPM, specifically sealing routes of entry, sanitation, and mechanical control methods that reduce rodent populations without the use of pesticides. • Rodenticide use is also an avoidable risk to children and pets, especially dogs, which are more vulnerable to secondary poisonings. • FGARs are not “safe” alternatives and should also be 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Board is aware of studies that researched rodent populations when human density was decreased. Reductions in human presence reduces food sources and the need to enter human dwellings to search for resources. BPC continues to advocate for individuals to use IPM such as exclusion, sanitation, and other non-chemicals methods of control. • The Board maintains that no pesticides are considered “safe” but they have varying levels of risk. FGARs are considered lower risk than SGARs because they have lower potency and require multiple exposures to kill their target pest. The Board will take this comment into consideration as it reviews public comments as they relate to the proposed rulemaking amendments. • Certified applicators are trained through extensive examinations and competency standards, and all commercial applicators must conduct their work under the supervision of a master operator/applicator. While applicators cannot completely eliminate the risk of secondary exposure to SGARs, they can use IPM tactics with rodenticide use in accordance with pesticide labels to minimize risks. While not required, carcass retrieval can greatly reduce the amount of poisoned or sick rodents that natural predators consume.

The Board maintains a number of IPM-related rodent resources on its websites, including through gotpests.org.• The Board acknowledges there may have been confusion about the public hearing hosted on February 27, 2026. The amendments to Chapter 40 were a part of an official rulemaking hearing and comments received have been reviewed by the Board for their final decision-making process. The public hearing on February 27, 2026 is in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act (APA, Title 5, Chapter 375).

The Board is aware that secondary poisonings from rodenticides can cause widespread issues for Maine’s wildlife. The Board agrees that wildlife predators can help control rodent populations in wild areas. In more residential and urban areas, raptors and predators may not be as abundant to control rodent populations, so other IPM tactics may be needed. The Board is not currently aware of any ground or surface water samples in Maine that have tested positive for rodenticides.
