So, you want to be a Mobile Bar in Maine



Unfortunately, Maine liquor laws do not provide for a mobile bar or food truck license. However, there may be other options to consider.

To utilize a mobile bar, you will need to qualify as a licensee under Title 28-A section 1052 or section 1076.

Section 1052 licenses are as follows.

- 1. Class A Restaurant
- 2. Class A Restaurant-Lounge
- 3. Class A Lounge
- 4. Hotel
- 5. Bed & Breakfast
- 6. Auditoriums
- 7. Civic Auditoriums
- 8. Performing Art Centers

Section 1076 licenses are as follows.

1. Qualified Catering Services

There are several pieces that are required by law to consider when applying for a license that will include a mobile bar as part of your business plan:

- 1. You will need a permanent "brick and mortar" structure
 - a. The Bureau does not license your mobile unit as a standalone qualifying facility.

- 2. You will need a qualifying kitchen licensed by the Department of Health and Human Service.
 - a. This kitchen may not be shared with other business entities regardless of whether or not those who are sharing the kitchen will have a liquor license.
- 3. You will be required to have additional licenses from other state agencies.
 - a. Heath Inspection Program at Department of Health Human Services.
 - b. Seller's Certificate from Maine Revenue Services
- 4. You will be required to obtain municipal approval through a public hearing process based on the process of the specific municipality.

As you develop your business plan, you must understand that there will be other regulatory requirements to qualify.
