 - If a licensed sales representative (SR) will be pouring beer, wine or spirits at the event, you must verify that the person is licensed by the Bureau as a sales representative and has received seller/server training.
 - Under Maine liquor laws, beer, wine and spirits can only be served from 5:00 am to 1:00 am of the next day, every day of the week, Sunday through Saturday. Event times cannot deviate from this statutory requirement.
