WITNESSETH, that for and in consideration of the payments and agreements hereinafter mentioned, to be made and performed by the Department, the Provider hereby agrees with the Department to furnish all qualified personnel, facilities, materials and services and in consultation with the Department, to perform the services, study or projects described in Rider A, and under the terms of this Agreement. The following riders are hereby incorporated into this Agreement and made part of it by reference:

RIDER A SPECIFICATIONS OF WORK TO BE PERFORMED

The contract herein establishes a Master Agreement contract under which Lidar product and services may be purchased from the Provider. The contract was competitively awarded through RFP 201508142 for Lidar Data Acquisition. The contract is for five years.

- > RFP 201508142 for Lidar Data Acquisition is documented in Rider D.
- Lidar data acquisition pricing, as provided by Quantum Spatial's response to RFP 201508142, is documented in Rider F.
- Quantum Spatial's/Providers response to RFP 201508142 for Lidar Data Acquisition is included by Reference as Rider H.

This Master Agreement contract may be used by other agencies within Maine State Government, towns, cities, counties and educational units within Maine, at their choice. Non-State Government contracts will be directly between the Contractor and contracting unit.

Process

Individual Delivery Orders (ordering documents) will be initiated by the State of Maine under this Master Agreement Contract for specific work product and services. The Delivery Orders will be for fixed price statement of work/change orders with fixed deliverables.

Request for Quote (RFQ) - The State shall define an Area of Interest to the contractor. The State shall define quality standards required and any buy-up options to be executed. The RFQ will contain sufficient detail to allow the Contractor to respond with a complete and accurate quote, and at a minimum will contain: contact information including technical, administrative and program area contacts; any draft or final drawings or area specifications; quality requirements, any deadlines for delivery of quote or deadlines related to final delivery and information on the Quality Assurance vendor and process to deliver the data.

Pricing for areas of interest will not exceed those outlined in Rider E cost schedule. Buy-up prices are to be added to the appropriate base cost for the total price of a buy-up. The Contractor shall collect Lidar within the area of interest plus a 100-meter buffer and ensure there are no gaps between existing lidar data and new lidar acquisition.

- RFQ Response Contractor will respond to the RFQ with a firm price, fixed cost response. As necessary, the RFQ response would include any design and planning documents or other such specifications that describe in detail the work to be performed. The RFQ Response shall include a project plan for completing the work. If the RFQ response as delivered to the Department is not acceptable, the Department may reject the response or the Department and Contractor may work together to refine the RFQ response to better meet the desired outcomes of the Department, at which time the Contractor will resubmit an RFQ Response. The RFQ response will detail mutually agreeable payment milestones. Payment milestones will be based on delivery of work product and acceptance of that product after suitable State review.
- Delivery Order Upon mutual acceptance of the RFQ Response the Department shall issue a Delivery Order authorizing the work, attaching the RFQ Response signed by both parties.

Work orders submitted by March 15th of each contract year shall be scheduled for collection during an appropriate window between April 1st and May 15th. Work orders submitted after March 15 of each contract year may be subject to collection in the fall window between October 1 and December 31 or during the spring collection window of the following year. Regardless of designated windows for data acquisition collection parameter requirements for leaf off, snow free and other conditions must be met unless a specific waiver is authorized in writing by the state's project manager.

Mobile lidar acquisitions projects have different quality, timeframe and condition requirements as outlined in the RFP. Mobile Lidar Acquisition will follow the same RFQ/Response/Delivery-Order process as standard Lidar Data Acquisition.

Deliverables

The Contractor shall deliver the resulting products in accordance with the delivery plan submitted in the quote response. For each work order, the Contractor shall provide:

Tiling Scheme and Data Format:

- 1) **Tile Coverage:** Tiles which lie completely within the project area shall be complete to the tile edges. Tiles which lie partially outside the project boundary shall be complete to the project boundary with enough overlap beyond the project boundary to ensure that no parts of the project are omitted.
- 2) Tile Size: Tiles shall be 1500 meters x 1500 meters. These tiles shall be on the same tile index grid as was used for the USGS "2014 Central Maine LiDAR Project" and 2015
 - a. Tiled deliverables shall conform to the tiling scheme, without added overlap.
 - b. Tiling scheme will be used for all tiled deliverables.
 - c. Tiled deliverables shall edge-match seamlessly in both the horizontal and vertical.
- 3) Tile Naming: Tiles shall be named according to the US National Grid conventions.
- 4) Spatial Reference System: The Spatial Reference System shall be: UTM, Zone 19, NAD83, Meters; NAVD88, Meters,
- 5) The following deliverable products shall be produced in accordance with the USGS Lidar Base Specification 1.2.
 - a. Raw Point Cloud Data
 - b. Classified Point Cloud
 - c. Bare Earth Surface (Raster DEM)
 - d. Control
 - e. Lidar Intensity Image

QA/QC Review and Approval

The contractor will work with the Department and its QA/QC contractor providing, acquisition plans, acquisition reports, and GPS/IMU results to ensure data acquisition and deliverables meet USGS QL2 standards. The contractor will review the Departments acceptance criteria specified to ensure its processes meet or exceed the criteria. Prior to initiating an acquisition the Contractor, Department and QA/QC contractor will develop and agree to a schedule and methodology for providing and review of data acquisition and product deliverables review.

RIDER B METHOD OF PAYMENT AND OTHER PROVISIONS

1. AGREEMENT AMOUNT \$ Master Agreement

2. **<u>INVOICES AND PAYMENTS</u>** The Department will pay the Contractor as follows:

Per payment agreement terms outlined in Request for Quote Response documented in an approved Delivery Order.

Invoices for the agreements should be sent to VMO.OIT@maine.gov.

Payments are subject to the Contractor's compliance with all items set forth in this Agreement and subject to the availability of funds. The Department will process approved payments within 30 days.

3. <u>BENEFITS AND DEDUCTIONS</u> If the Provider is an individual, the Provider understands and agrees that he/she is an independent contractor for whom no Federal or State Income Tax will be deducted by the Department, and for whom no retirement benefits, survivor benefit insurance, group life insurance, vacation and sick leave, and similar benefits available to State employees will accrue. The Provider further understands that annual information returns, as required by the Internal Revenue Code or State of Maine Income Tax Law, will be filed by the State Controller with the Internal Revenue Service and the State of Maine Bureau of Revenue Services, copies of which will be furnished to the Provider for his/her Income Tax records.

4. **INDEPENDENT CAPACITY** In the performance of this Agreement, the parties hereto agree that the Provider, and any agents and employees of the Provider shall act in the capacity of an independent contractor and not as officers or employees or agents of the State.

5. <u>DEPARTMENT'S REPRESENTATIVE</u> The Agreement Administrator shall be the Department's representative during the period of this Agreement. He/she has authority to curtail services if necessary to ensure proper execution. He/she shall certify to the Department when payments under the Agreement are due and the amounts to be paid. He/she shall make decisions on all claims of the Provider, subject to the approval of the Commissioner of the Department.

6. <u>AGREEMENT ADMINISTRATOR</u> All progress reports, correspondence and related submissions from the Provider shall be submitted to:

who is designated as the Agreement Administrator on behalf of the Department for this Agreement, except where specified otherwise in this Agreement.

7. <u>CHANGES IN THE WORK</u> The Department may order changes in the work, the Agreement Amount being adjusted accordingly. Any monetary adjustment or any substantive change in the work shall be in the form of an amendment, signed by both parties and approved by the State Purchases Review Committee. Said amendment must be effective prior to execution of the work.

8. <u>SUB-AGREEMENTS</u> Unless provided for in this Agreement, no arrangement shall be made by the Provider with any other party for furnishing any of the services herein contracted for without the consent and approval of the Agreement Administrator. Any sub-agreement hereunder entered into subsequent to the execution of this Agreement must be annotated "approved" by the Agreement Administrator before it is reimbursable hereunder. This provision will not be taken as requiring the approval of contracts of employment between the Provider and its employees assigned for services thereunder.

9. <u>SUBLETTING, ASSIGNMENT OR TRANSFER</u> The Provider shall not sublet, sell, transfer, assign or otherwise dispose of this Agreement or any portion thereof, or of its right, title or interest therein, without written request to and written consent of the Agreement Administrator. No subcontracts or transfer of agreement shall in any case release the Provider of its liability under this Agreement.

10. <u>EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY</u> During the performance of this Agreement, the Provider agrees as follows:

a. The Provider shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment relating to this Agreement because of race, color, religious creed, sex, national origin, ancestry, age, physical or mental disability, or sexual orientation, unless related to a bona fide occupational qualification. The Provider shall take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, age, national origin, physical or mental disability, or sexual orientation.

Such action shall include but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotions, or transfers; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoffs or terminations; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training including apprenticeship. The Provider agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

b. The Provider shall, in all solicitations or advertising for employees placed by or on behalf of the Provider relating to this Agreement, state that all qualified applicants shall receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religious creed, sex, national origin, ancestry, age, physical or mental disability, or sexual orientation.

c. The Provider shall send to each labor union or representative of the workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement, or other agreement or understanding, whereby it is furnished with labor for the performance of this Agreement a notice to be provided by the contracting agency, advising the said labor union or workers' representative of the Provider's commitment under this section and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

d. The Provider shall inform the contracting Department's Equal Employment Opportunity Coordinator of any discrimination complaints brought to an external regulatory body (Maine Human Rights Commission, EEOC, Office of Civil Rights) against their agency by any individual as well as any lawsuit regarding alleged discriminatory practice.

e. The Provider shall comply with all aspects of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) in employment and in the provision of service to include accessibility and reasonable accommodations for employees and clients.

f. Contractors and subcontractors with contracts in excess of \$50,000 shall also pursue in good faith affirmative action programs.

g. The Provider shall cause the foregoing provisions to be inserted in any subcontract for any work covered by this Agreement so that such provisions shall be binding upon each subcontractor, provided that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to contracts or subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.

11. **EMPLOYMENT AND PERSONNEL** The Provider shall not engage any person in the employ of any State Department or Agency in a position that would constitute a violation of 5 MRSA § 18 or 17 MRSA § 3104. The Contractor shall not engage on a full-time, part-time or other basis during the period of this Agreement, any other personnel who are or have been at any time during the period of this Agreement in the employ of any State Department or Agency, except regularly retired employees, without the written consent of the State Purchases Review Committee. Further, the Provider shall not engage on this project on a full-time, part-time or other basis during the period of this Agreement any retired employee of the Department who has not been retired for at least one year, without the written consent of the State Purchases Review Committee. The Provider shall cause the foregoing provisions to be inserted in any subcontract for any work covered by this Agreement so that such provisions shall be binding upon each subcontractor, provided that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to contracts or subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.

12. <u>STATE EMPLOYEES NOT TO BENEFIT</u> No individual employed by the State at the time this Agreement is executed or any time thereafter shall be admitted to any share or part of this Agreement or to any benefit that might arise therefrom directly or indirectly that would constitute a violation of 5 MRSA § 18 or 17 MRSA § 3104. No other individual employed by the State at the time this Agreement is executed or any time thereafter shall be admitted to any share or part of this Agreement or to any benefit that might arise therefrom directly or indirectly due to his employment by or financial interest in the Provider or any affiliate of the Provider, without the written consent of the State Purchases Review Committee. The Provider shall cause the foregoing provisions to be inserted in any subcontract for any work covered by this Agreement so that such provisions shall be binding upon each subcontractor, provided that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to contracts or subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.

13. <u>WARRANTY</u> The Provider warrants that it has not employed or contracted with any company or person, other than for assistance with the normal study and preparation of a proposal, to solicit or secure this Agreement and that it has not paid, or agreed to pay, any company or person,

other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Provider, any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gifts, or any other consideration, contingent upon, or resulting from the award for making this Agreement. For breach or violation of this warranty, the Department shall have the right to annul this Agreement without liability or, in its discretion to otherwise recover the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or contingent fee.

ACCESS TO RECORDS As a condition of accepting a contract for services under this 14. section, a contractor must agree to treat all records, other than proprietary information, relating to personal services work performed under the contract as public records under the freedom of access laws to the same extent as if the work were performed directly by the department or agency. For the purposes of this subsection, "proprietary information" means information that is a trade secret or commercial or financial information, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive position of the contractor and would make available information not otherwise publicly available. Information relating to wages and benefits of the employees performing the personal services work under the contract and information concerning employee and contract oversight and accountability procedures and systems are not proprietary information. The Provider shall maintain all books, documents, payrolls, papers, accounting records and other evidence pertaining to this Agreement and make such materials available at its offices at all reasonable times during the period of this Agreement and for such subsequent period as specified under Maine Uniform Accounting and Auditing Practices for Community Agencies (MAAP) rules. The Provider shall allow inspection of pertinent documents by the Department or any authorized representative of the State of Maine or Federal Government, and shall furnish copies thereof, if requested. This subsection applies to contracts, contract extensions and contract amendments executed on or after October 1, 2009.

15. <u>**TERMINATION**</u> The performance of work under the Agreement may be terminated by the Department in whole, or in part, whenever for any reason the Agreement Administrator shall determine that such termination is in the best interest of the Department. Any such termination shall be effected by delivery to the Provider of a Notice of Termination specifying the extent to which performance of the work under the Agreement is terminated and the date on which such termination becomes effective. The Agreement shall be equitably adjusted to compensate for such termination, and modified accordingly.

16. <u>GOVERNMENTAL REQUIREMENTS</u> The Provider warrants and represents that it will comply with all governmental ordinances, laws and regulations.

17. **GOVERNING LAW** This Agreement shall be governed in all respects by the laws, statutes, and regulations of the United States of America and of the State of Maine. Any legal proceeding against the State regarding this Agreement shall be brought in State of Maine administrative or judicial forums. The Provider consents to personal jurisdiction in the State of Maine.

18. **STATE HELD HARMILESS** The Provider agrees to indemnify, defend and save harmless the State, its officers, agents and employees from any and all claims, costs, expenses, injuries, liabilities, losses and damages of every kind and description (hereinafter in this paragraph referred to as "claims") resulting from or arising out of the performance of this Agreement by the Provider, its employees, agents, or subcontractors. Claims to which this indemnification applies include, but without limitation, the following: (i) claims suffered or incurred by any contractor, subcontractor, materialman, laborer and any other person, firm, corporation or other legal entity (hereinafter in this paragraph referred to as "person") providing work, services, materials, equipment or supplies in connection with the performance of this Agreement; (ii) claims arising out of a violation or

infringement of any proprietary right, copyright, trademark, right of privacy or other right arising out of publication, translation, development, reproduction, delivery, use, or disposition of any data, information or other matter furnished or used in connection with this Agreement; (iii) Claims arising out of a libelous or other unlawful matter used or developed in connection with this Agreement; (iv) claims suffered or incurred by any person who may be otherwise injured or damaged in the performance of this Agreement; and (v) all legal costs and other expenses of defense against any asserted claims to which this indemnification applies. This indemnification does not extend to a claim that results solely and directly from (i) the Department's negligence or unlawful act, or (ii) action by the Provider taken in reasonable reliance upon an instruction or direction given by an authorized person acting on behalf of the Department in accordance with this Agreement.

19. **NOTICE OF CLAIMS** The Provider shall give the Contract Administrator immediate notice in writing of any legal action or suit filed related in any way to the Agreement or which may affect the performance of duties under the Agreement, and prompt notice of any claim made against the Provider by any subcontractor which may result in litigation related in any way to the Agreement or which may affect the performance of duties under the Agreement.

20. <u>APPROVAL</u> This Agreement must have the approval of the State Controller and the State Purchases Review Committee before it can be considered a valid, enforceable document.

21. **LIABILITY INSURANCE** The Provider shall keep in force a liability policy issued by a company fully licensed or designated as an eligible surplus line insurer to do business in this State by the Maine Department of Professional & Financial Regulation, Bureau of Insurance, which policy includes the activity to be covered by this Agreement with adequate liability coverage to protect itself and the Department from suits. Providers insured through a "risk retention group" insurer prior to July 1, 1991 may continue under that arrangement. Prior to or upon execution of this Agreement, the Provider shall furnish the Department with written or photocopied verification of the existence of such liability insurance policy.

22. <u>NON-APPROPRIATION</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, if the State does not receive sufficient funds to fund this Agreement and other obligations of the State, if funds are de-appropriated, or if the State does not receive legal authority to expend funds from the Maine State Legislature or Maine courts, then the State is not obligated to make payment under this Agreement.

23. <u>SEVERABILITY</u> The invalidity or unenforceability of any particular provision or part thereof of this Agreement shall not affect the remainder of said provision or any other provisions, and this Agreement shall be construed in all respects as if such invalid or unenforceable provision or part thereof had been omitted.

24. **INTEGRATION** All terms of this Agreement are to be interpreted in such a way as to be consistent at all times with the terms of Rider B (except for expressed exceptions to Rider B included in Rider C), followed in precedence by Rider A, and any remaining Riders in alphabetical order.

25. **FORCE MAJEURE** The Department may, at its discretion, excuse the performance of an obligation by a party under this Agreement in the event that performance of that obligation by that party is prevented by an act of God, act of war, riot, fire, explosion, flood or other catastrophe, sabotage, severe shortage of fuel, power or raw materials, change in law, court order, national

defense requirement, or strike or labor dispute, provided that any such event and the delay caused thereby is beyond the control of, and could not reasonably be avoided by, that party. The Department may, at its discretion, extend the time period for performance of the obligation excused under this section by the period of the excused delay together with a reasonable period to reinstate compliance with the terms of this Agreement.

26. <u>SET-OFF RIGHTS</u> The State shall have all of its common law, equitable and statutory rights of set-off. These rights shall include, but not be limited to, the State's option to withhold for the purposes of set-off any monies due to the Provider under this Agreement up to any amounts due and owing to the State with regard to this Agreement, any other Agreement, any other Agreement with any State department or agency, including any Agreement for a term commencing prior to the term of this Agreement, plus any amounts due and owing to the State for any other reason including, without limitation, tax delinquencies, fee delinquencies or monetary penalties relative thereto. The State shall exercise its set-off rights in accordance with normal State practices including, in cases of set-off pursuant to an audit, the finalization of such audit by the State agency, its representatives, or the State Controller.

27. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT** This document contains the entire Agreement of the parties, and neither party shall be bound by any statement or representation not contained herein. No waiver shall be deemed to have been made by any of the parties unless expressed in writing and signed by the waiving party. The parties expressly agree that they shall not assert in any action relating to the Agreement that any implied waiver occurred between the parties which is not expressed in writing. The failure of any party to insist in any one or more instances upon strict performance of any of the terms or provisions of the Agreement, or to exercise an option or election under the Agreement, shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment for the future of such terms, provisions, option or election, but the same shall continue in full force and effect, and no waiver by any party of any one or more of its rights or remedies under the Agreement shall be deemed to be a waiver of any prior or subsequent rights or remedy under the Agreement or at law.

RIDER C EXCEPTIONS TO RIDER B

Rider B-IT 15. TERMINATION is deleted and replaced with:

15. TERMINATION This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice specifying the effective date of such termination. In the event of termination by the Department, Provider shall be paid for services performed in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, less all costs caused by non-performance, failed performance, or defective performance. Any such termination shall be effected by delivery to the other party of a Notice of Termination specifying the extent to which performance of the work under the Agreement is terminated and the date on which such termination becomes effective.
