Follow MOGFA etc. guidance; decrease in pesticides/herbicides. A little vague on this section but I can infer from other parts of the proposal that the overall sustainability of the farm will be increased.

Additional greenhouse will increase sales, particularly in off-season. Some competition locally, but they are aware and they are taking advantage of current market. Survey was a good idea.

Ultimately a strong proposal and will be interested to see how the bar coding and marketing efforts pay off in the years to come.

B. Character and Management Capacity

Yes, definitely feel that the owners along with their family/advisors are deeply experienced and rooted in the project and are committed to seeing it succeed.

C. Financial Capacity and Debt Management

Highly leveraged. The current cash flow and margins are definitely tight; unclear if the numbers presented represent any loss of revenue from COVID (eg, restaurants that may be closed or working at limited capacity). Actuals may be even tighter than presented here. At the same time, both owners have external jobs and have demonstrated their ability to manage debt payments.

Lots of environmental improvements; some physical improvements.

B. Character and Management Capacity

The farm has been operating successfully since 2009. One owner has a B.S in Plant and Soil Sciences/Sustainable Agriculture and worked on three farms prior to coming to Belmont. The other owner studied at UMO for three years and has expertise in welding, fabrication, and overall equipment maintenance, and had farm experience prior to purchasing Bahner Farm. Together, the owners have 29 years of vegetable production and farm management experience. The owners manage 3-full-time and 6-8 part-time employees annually, own 49 acres and lease 10 and manage a greenhouse, 6 hoophouses and a farmstand. Farmstand sales have grown by 20% annually during the past six years. They have established business connections with a wholesale operation, several coops, and participate in 3 farmers' markets. They also are affiliated with Daybreak Growers Alliance (of which Christa is an owner), Belfast Coop, Good Tern Coop, ten restaurants (although restaurant sales may be minimal this year due to Covid-19), and other sales outlets. They work collaboratively with other farms in the area. Farm appears to be achieving excellent crop yields and quality.

C. Financial Capacity and Debt Management

The proposed expansion has been thought through very well, with intended enhanced income from several aspects of the operation. Cash flow for the operation is good despite labor and other costs. The new greenhouse, providing expanded production, is predicted to provide greatly expanded income. Increasing retail space for seedling sales will enhance sales of these items. Winter wholesale production is predicted to increase by 300% over the next 5 years, which is a primary impetus for the expansion. A substantial line of credit from a local bank is available, if needed, as well as credit cards, and some family assistance. The farm exit plan, in the unlikely case that it should be utilized, is a logical plan.

D. Collateral and Asset Base

The farm already appears to have high yields of high-quality greens, vegetable and seedlings. The proposed expansion should enhance the good growing practices that already are in place. One owner has extensive welding, fabricating, and equipment maintenance and repair skills. The farm is organically certified, which includes minimal reliance on pesticides and herbicides and promotes soil health, encouragement of beneficials, and minimal risks to pollinators. Utilizing this land for these types of farming practices on a busy highway also reduces the probability that the land will be developed for housing or for non-farm related enterprises that may not be as environmentally friendly.

Agreement letters from buyers have been obtained which attest to this. Expanded production capabilities would allow retention of existing employees and hiring of additional employees on a year-round basis, which more likely ensures an experienced, committed labor force. General public has recognized the value of purchasing locally produced food and seedlings and are willing to pay a premium price for them. There is some direct competition with other local farms regarding the expanded volume of products proposed to be produced, but that competition appears to be minimal. Operation is on a major highway with estimated 7000 vehicles passing daily is a plus.

F. Other Conditions

1. Conservation Objectives

Locally produced food and seedlings encourages customers to purchase these local products rather than purchasing items that are trucked in long distances with the associated fuel usage, pollution produced, etc. These organic products are produced without using certain chemical pesticides and fertilizers, thereby minimizing fossil fuel usage, which benefits soils and pollinators. The farm's organic practices conform to MOFGA and NRCS recommended practices for protection of soil and other natural resources. Given recent and predicted weather variables, growing crops under cover reduces certain weather-related risks of crop production, and often enhances yields, quality, and can minimize environmental impacts of crop production.

3. Degree of Change

The Business Plan provides evidence of applicant's knowledge, experience and management capacity to successfully plan and implement the proposed changes to the Farm Business.

Owner has a B.S. in Economics and Sustainable Agriculture. Has been farming since 2009. Has modified the primary location of the business, constructed a large pond for field irrigation, drilled two wells for the wash/pack facility, and built 2 walk-in coolers to accommodate the field production and that from four (40,000 sf) existing greenhouses. Is experienced in greenhouse construction. Has expanded operation from 600 to 1500 CSA shares annually. The CSA delivery model, whereby people receive products without having to leave their homes, is working well considering Covid-19 issues, and direct delivery of products to the home is increasingly desired by consumers. Farmer is considering single greenhouse crops and agritourism as future ventures when the operation can sustain these activities. Has increased customer base by 17% annually since 2015. Has specific employees assigned to handle specific tasks but may have to re-assess how this labor is assigned to various tasks, as labor cost seems high. Has a professional advisory team.

Financial Capacity and Debt Management

The proposed changes to the Farm Business will improve the cash flow thereby improving the management of debt load needed to pay any new debt associated with the proposed change(s) to the Farm Business.

Had to purchase \$40,000 of buy-ins to meet demand in 2019, which suggests that expanded production is warranted. Revenue projections seem to make sense. Uses Facebook, radio, direct mailings and brochure for promotion. Has own website updated weekly. Data predict positive cash flow after development of the project. Balance sheet equity is positive.

Expansion of greenhouse production is a hedge against weather variables and reduces soil erosion. Has four vans for deliveries. Has invested in equipment for one-pass bed preparation, fertilization, etc., which reduces labor, fuel costs, soil compaction, and improves crop yields and quality. Has a mechanical transplanter which has resulted in labor efficiencies for planting and reduces weed issues by using transplants instead of direct seeding. Is organic; therefore, weed control is difficult, so plastic mulch is essential for some crops. Purchased a crop washer.

Farm Vitality & Development of New Capital

The Business Plan demonstrates, through better strategies, marketing, production efficiencies and upgrading of facilities and equipment, an increase in profitability and overall net worth that will improve the overall sustainability of the Farm Business.

Farm is located within 30 minutes of five large metropolitan areas for distribution of products, which are organically produced for the CSA. Sells some buy-ins, e.g., eggs. Additional greenhouses will increase production from 1-2 to 3-4 harvests annually, expand the year 'round business, and provide for hiring more farm workers. Expansion of the base operation with 4 additional, 30X200 greenhouses will enable the owner to concentrate more on management of the business. Has competition in the area and limited land access; yet, seems to have a loyal and increasing customer base. Wholesale accounts will be developed as needed. Will grow some new crops for diversification and to keep customer interest. Considering selling lifetime shares – a new, unproven concept. Considering leasing and purchasing more land – may or may not be feasible from a financial and availability standpoint. Customer base over 700 annually – has built many solid customer relationships, with an average purchase of \$570 annually. Sells to a few co-ops.
