### Award Justification Statement 2021 Waste Diversion Grants Program, Round I—RFP# 202103040

#### I. Summary

On March 19, 2021, the Maine Department of Environmental Protection, in accordance with 38 MRSA §2201-B, Maine Solid Waste Diversion Grant Program, issued RFP# 202103040, that sought proposals for the development, implementation or improvement of programs, projects, initiatives or activities designed to increase the diversion of solid waste from disposal, including waste reduction activities. Maine law (38 MRSA §2132.1-B) sets a goal of reducing the amount of waste disposed per capita by 5% every five years. The Department believes that progress toward this goal can be achieved by implementing innovative and proven local, regional and statewide initiatives aimed at reducing the generation of solid waste, and at increasing the recovery and utilization of discarded materials, including organics. A total of 18 proposals were initially received. Five proposals failed to meet minimum match requirements of 25% of the total project cost and were disgualified (not scored). The remaining 13 proposals were evaluated by a qualified team of individuals from the Department's Division of Materials Management. Seven projects were finally chosen for funding following a competitive, consensus-based evaluation process. Proposals chosen showed significant potential to divert materials away from costly disposal practices, while simultaneously focusing on the goals of Maine's "Solid Waste Management Hierarchy" (38 M.R.S. § 2101).

#### **II.** Evaluation Process

Prior to initiation of the RFP process, an evaluation team was established, comprised of qualified reviewers, each with specific solid waste expertise, from the Division of Materials Management. The evaluation team was trained with regard to the RFP review/evaluation process and conducted their individual reviews of proposals. Following individual reviews, the evaluation team met on December 10, 2020 to discuss, as a group, the merits of each proposal and rank them. Each proposal was then scored using a consensus-based evaluation system. The maximum achievable score was 100 points, based on the following categories:

- Organization, Qualifications and Experience (15 points),
- Proposed Services (50 points), and
- Cost Proposal (35 points)

Scores were assigned based upon the following criteria:

- The applicant's ability to address key solid waste management goals,
- The project's anticipated return for the investment (money, time),

- The project's efficiency in achieving expected outcomes, in terms of proposed work, budget and time frame, and
- The amount and quality of proposed matching funds or services.

#### III. Qualifications & Experience

This year's round of proposals contained a large number of qualified individuals, governmental entities and businesses. One of the most important deciding factors for our evaluation team was proven experience and ability to adapt to changing circumstances. Those entities chosen for funding also possessed the following additional qualifications/experience:

- Operate using a proven business model;
- Apply strong educational outreach efforts;
- Have the ability to develop strong community partnerships;
- Show a strong commitment to future growth of their proposed program; and/or
- Utilize or propose technology that is adaptable and scalable to fit many solid waste management scenarios.

#### **IV.** Proposed Services

During the evaluation process, our team focused on the following key "proposed services" factors—determining that the project as proposed will:

- Address an identified solid waste management need,
- Take advantage of regional economies of scale,
- Increase organics management and recycling infrastructure in underserved areas of the state,
- Promote waste reduction through reuse, repair and sharing economy initiatives,
- Reduce wasted food through donation or other sharing initiatives,
- Address a statewide need, and/or
- Expand the types of materials managed through composting and recycling.

#### V. Cost Proposal

The applicant's requests ranged from a low of \$337.50 to help develop a small backyard compost site at a community garden to a high of \$40,000.00 to help develop community recycling depot in a populous part of Maine. Because the

Waste Diversion Grants program operates solely as a grant, we did not compare the costs of each project against one another but judged each based on individual merit.

### VI. Conclusion

The seven proposals chosen for funding represented the best opportunities to expand collection, diversion and reuse of various solid waste materials. A common theme among the projects selected was moving materials away from disposal in support of higher and better end uses in accordance with the state's solid waste management hierarchy.

  - Applicant indicates that their contributions to the overall project include in-depth research, systems design, and legislative drafting that have already been completed, but does not provide examples of completed projects.
  - Project relies on partners, but it is not clear that participation has been confirmed.
  - The applicant states that they will hire people based on how much funding they have but appear to be relying on additional grants to complete much of the grant work cited as match.
    - 1. The applicant states that they "don't have history and relevant experience. They (will) hire people as funding allows to do specific tasks as the demand arises.... The rest of the personnel will not come on board until we get one of the three \$million+ grants in the queue." This last statement suggests that the team of scientists is currently not engaged in the proposed project and will not be part of the proposed study if funded by the grant unless additional grant funding from other sources comes through. This makes it difficult to determine how much of this grant work could be accomplished should the other grants (which are not identified) not be funded.
  - The applicant also has stated that they do not have any projects to offer for an assessment of their qualifications as required by the RFP# 202103040, due to the fact they are a "start-up"

Part IV, Proposal Submission Requirements, Section II.1 of RFP# 202103040 states in relevant part: "Bidders must complete **Appendix C** (Qualifications and Experience Form) describing their gualifications and skills to provide the requested services in the RFP. Bidders must include three examples of projects which demonstrate their experience and expertise in performing these services as well as highlighting the Bidder's stated qualifications and skills."

• The applicant states that their "Organization Chart" consists of Ken Capron; one executive assistant and <u>one or two Technical investigators</u>. The applicant has not provided names of his associates or clear and concise information regarding the experiences and qualifications of his team, making it difficult to properly evaluate their qualifications and experiences.

Part IV, Proposal Submission Requirements, Section II.3 of RFP#202103040 states in relevant part: "Bidders must provide an organizational chart. The organization chart must include the project being proposed. Each position must be identified by position title and corresponding to the personnel job descriptions." The applicant has failed to provide this information.

- The Applicant has submitted a "<u>Clarifications</u> of false assumption from last year's application" of which several of the points bring up further questions/concerns:
  - Point #1, the applicant is using the notion that because they are a new "entrepreneurial undertaking" (September 2020 Start Up), they are not required to demonstrate prior knowledge or experience in the solar waste recycling field, nor do they need to provide specific financial data as they do not have any to give. Finally, the applicant states clearly that they "don't have history and relevant experience. They (will) hire people as funding allows to do specific tasks as the demand arises. This lack of important information makes evaluation of the proposal very difficult.
  - 2. **Point #4**, "<u>The experience... 50 years of administrative experience.</u> The rest of the personnel will not come on board until we get one of the three \$million+ grants in the queue." This proposal did not follow the format or answer all the questions required in the RFP. The following items were omitted from the proposal:

- The applicant provided no Financial Statements or Balance Sheets representing any recent activities. Submission of a Dunn and Bradstreet BIRS was also dismissed by the applicant.
- The applicant provided no proof of insurance
- The applicant failed to provide the three examples of projects completed in the past to indicate experience or expertise
- No information was provided of any subcontractors (investigative associates) who would perform data collection specific to this grant proposal.
- No timeline / work plan was addressed in the proposal.
- While the applicant describes four team members with a few sentences each, there are no documents of mutual agreement provided: no contracts, no MOUs or letters of interest.
- Further in the proposal, the applicant states "The rest of the personnel will not come on board until we get one of three \$million+ grants in the queue." The applicant provides no information on the status of said grants.
- Most of the language of the proposal describes the larger project which the applicant proposes we disregard. It is very difficult to do this when the applicant intertwines the two, including on the cost proposal where funds expected from a grant(s) from the DOE are shown as match for the current project, (Funds applied for? One or multiple grants?)

Notes: This has been a frustrating proposal for this reviewer, and I sense it has been so for Mr. Capron as well. I believe that the frustration arises from the fact that this particular grant program is ill-suited for entrepreneurial start-ups which require funds exposed to significantly higher risk.

This proposal falls outside the Departments stated goals in the RFP as seen below:

Bidders must include three examples of projects which demonstrate their experience and expertise in performing these services as well as highlighting the Bidder's stated qualifications and skills."
        - a. the applicant further states that they "<u>don't have history and</u> <u>relevant experience. They (will) hire people as funding allows to</u> <u>do specific tasks as the demand arises</u>. This lack of important information makes evaluation of the proposal very difficult.
    - The applicant states that their "Organization Chart" consists of Ken Capron; one executive assistant and <u>one or two Technical investigators</u>. The applicant has not provided names of his associates or clear and concise information regarding the experiences and qualifications of his team, making it difficult to properly evaluate their qualifications and experiences.

Part IV, Proposal Submission Requirements, Section II.3 of RFP#202103040 states in relevant part: "Bidders must provide an organizational chart. The organization chart must include the project being proposed. Each position must be identified by position title and corresponding to the personnel job descriptions." The applicant has failed to provide this information.

- Certificate of insurance-The applicant has not submitted a Certificate of Insurance as required by RFP# 202103040, Part IV, Section II.6 which states in relevant part, "Bidders must provide a certificate of insurance on a standard Acord form (or the equivalent) evidencing the Bidder's general liability, professional liability and any other relevant liability insurance policies that might be associated with the proposed services."

#### II. Proposed Services:

  - The project focuses on collecting data on solar panel chemistry, recyclability and feasibility of establishing efforts to recycle individual panel components. Much of the technical research will require scientific partners will be added only if other funding, besides the WDG, are secured.
  - The proposal does not address waste management issues associated with solar panel recycling and the project as proposed, does not appear to offer any measurable waste diversion.
- 2. Implementation Work Plan
  - The applicant has not supplied an "Implementation- Work Plan" as the "conceptual" project has yet to start. Instead, he simply states that it will occur within the two-year timeframe of the grant—no specifics offered as required by RFP# 202103040, Part IV, Section III.2:

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Individual Evaluator Comments: Based on this reviewer's evaluation of the application, this grant is missing a significant amount of information required by the RFP and is therefore ineligible. While the project targets a waste material that is a high priority, the application does not provide sufficient information. A more detailed analysis of how the application failed to comply with the RFP requirements is provided in the comments below by section.

- I. Organization Qualifications and Experience
  - 1. Overview of Organization
    - Applicant indicates that their contributions to the overall project include in-depth research, systems design, and legislative drafting that have already been completed, but does not provide examples of completed projects.
    - Project relies on partners, but it is not clear that participation has been confirmed.
    - The applicant states that they have no projects to offer for an assessment of their qualifications, which the RFP requires, because they are a startup.
    - The applicant states that their organizational chart, which is required by the RFP, consists of the applicant; one executive assistant and one (or two) other staff.
      - 1. Staff are not named, nor is information provided on experiences or qualifications of the team.
    - The applicant did not provide a balance sheet, income statement, or business information report snapshot, as required by the RFP.
    - The applicant did not provide a certificate of insurance, as required by the RFP.
    - The applicant states that they will hire people based on how much funding they have but appear to be relying on additional grants to complete much of the grant work cited as match.
      - The applicant states that they "don't have history and relevant experience. They (will) hire people as funding allows to do specific tasks as the demand arises.... The rest of the personnel will not come on board until we get one of the three \$million+ grants in the queue." This last statement suggests that the team of scientists is currently not engaged in the proposed project and will not be part of the proposed study if funded by the grant unless additional grant funding from other sources comes through. This makes it difficult to determine how much of this grant work could be accomplished should the other grants (which are not identified) not be funded.
- II. Proposed Services:
  - The project work that would be funded through the grant would be collecting data on solar panel chemistry and recycling in an effort to determine how to fully

- Solar panels that are no longer usable are a waste stream identified as problematic by the Department.
  - Solar panel waste management should be addressed before unmanageable quantities are coming off the market.

#### III. Implementation – Work Plan

• The applicant did not provide a work plan or timeline, as required by the RFP, stating that the project is conceptual and will be completed within the grant's two-year timeframe.

#### IV. Cost Proposal

- Proposal shows 97% match but states in regard to the previous application as well as the current application that the grant review committee "failed to differentiate between the aspects of the project that would be funded by the WD grant and those which will be funded by one or more other grants which have no bearing here. Please focus on the \$40,000 being sought."
  - 1. This indicates that the fund amounts listed as match are not established sources of available funds, making it difficult to determine whether there is any actual match available at this time.
- The applicant lists as match the purchase of equipment, materials, and facilities including a warehouse, but there is no plan to site a location or build equipment included as part of the application.
- The applicant indicates the purpose of the grant project is to conduct research if no physical work or construction is part of this grant project, potential construction of a yet-to-be-planned facility would not count as match.
  - 1. All but \$2,500 of the requested funds are for labor for staff, which does not align with the RFP.
