#### PART III: SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

1. Provide a more detailed description and explain the need for the goods, services or grant to supplement the response in Part I.

The Maine Public Utilities Commission (Commission) is preparing to conduct several competitive solicitations: (1) the Northern Maine Renewable Energy Development Program (Northern Maine Program), which consists of two solicitations for: (a) a transmission line or lines necessary to connect at least 1,200 MW of renewable energy resources located in northern Maine, and (b) gualified renewable energy generation projects in northern Maine designed to connect to and transmit generated power using the transmission line; and (2) the Offshore Wind Energy Procurement Program (OSW Program) for the development and construction of offshore wind power projects. Section 3408 requires the Governor's Energy Office (GEO) to prepare, in consultation with applicable state agencies including the Commission, an RFP for each round of the competitive solicitation. Power Advisory will provide the Commission with strategic and timely support to design and implement successful procurements under the Northern Maine Renewable Energy Development Program (Northern Maine Program) and the Offshore Wind Energy Procurement Program (OSW Program). Support will cover all relevant considerations, including best practices and lessons learned from other jurisdictions, whether and how to coordinate with other procuring entities, maximizing regional and federal funding, addressing project-on-project risk of separately developed generation and transmission, design of procurements, resulting agreements, and reporting requirements, and identification and mitigation of risks to both Programs.

2. Provide a brief justification for the selected vendor to supplement the response in Part II. Reference the RFP number, if applicable.

Power Advisory is uniquely qualified to provide this support, with team members having worked on over fifty competitive solicitations. This includes numerous clean energy solicitations including over ten offshore wind solicitations. Power Advisory has extensive experience supporting renewable procurements for other jurisdictions including RFP development, proposal evaluations and contract design, as well as experience assessing and supporting transmission development solutions. Based on this experience Power Advisory has a strong understanding of the procurement frameworks used by other New England states, which will assist in evaluating opportunities for coordination with these states. In addition, in the last two years Power Advisory has assisted the Commission in its negotiations with Pine Tree Offshore Wind regarding the Maine Research Array, heightening its understanding of the Commission and the Maine regulatory environment.

The Commission will begin developing the first RFP very soon, and requires support for both the content of the RFP as well as optimizing timing of release considering numerous factors including statutory objectives, ongoing regional transmission procurement activity and possible multi-state coordination. In addition, the GEO has begun developing its OSW Program RFP. The Commission requires Power Advisory's services to best support our consultation and coordination efforts.
