PART III: SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

1. Provide a more detailed description and explain the need for the goods, services or grant to supplement the response in Part I.

Maine's moose season structure has remained unchanged for roughly 20 years. Recently, however, there has been renewed interest in revisiting the moose season structure and timing to determine whether changes would help to better meet the preferences of hunters, nonconsumptive recreationists such as tourists and wildlife viewers, and other groups. Following the recommendation of a stakeholder group established by a Legislative resolve, the Department is seeking to implement scientific research to determine the extent of potential dissatisfaction with the current moose season structure and timing as well as support for various alternative options under consideration. The research will assist in decision-making that may impact changes to the 2025 moose season.

Responsive Management will conduct a quantitative (survey) and qualitative (online public forum) study of licensed Maine hunters, Maine residents, licensed Maine guides, Maine tourism-oriented businesses, and large industrial landowners to assess attitudes towards Maine's moose hunt's season timing and length and potential conflicts among outdoor users. This includes a multi-modal survey approach where participants are contacted by phone, mail, and/or email to improve response rate and limit survey bias. Survey data are collected over the phone or via an online platform. The survey will be programmed to skip and/or substitute phrases based on the response to previous surveys with survey response immediately input into the database by trained staff handling the call.

Responsive Management will also design, host, and maintain an online public input forum (i.e., a virtual "Town Hall") through which residents may submit comments regarding the study topics to generate qualitative input and feedback from residents regarding their opinions on and attitudes toward Maine's current moose season and associated issues.

2. Provide a brief justification for the selected vendor to supplement the response in Part II. Reference the RFP number, if applicable.

Responsive Management was selected to conduct MDIFW's Big Game Survey in 2016 using a competitive process. Responsive Management has 32 years of experience with human dimension research on natural resource issues for state fish and wildlife agency in the US which makes Responsive Management a highly qualified vendor for collecting scientific data on public opinions to help inform agency management decisions.

Additionally, we have worked closely with this vendor to complete a variety of surveys since 2016. Working with this vendor adds additional efficiency to meet an aggressive timeline for completing this effort by September 30, 2024 to report back to the Maine Legislature and inform potential regulatory changes in 2025.

3. Explain how the negotiated costs or rates are fair and reasonable; or how the funding was allocated to grantee.

The costs are based on those from the 2016 Big Game Survey, the 2019 Furbearer Management Survey and updated project sample sizes, the addition of a quantitative survey (design and host online public input forum), and adjustments due to inflation. The cost of the survey is comparable to prior survey efforts awarded through a competitive process.

Responsive Management was selected to conduct the 2016 Big Game Survey through a competitive process. RFPs will be conducted periodically to ensure a competitive process for this service.
