### PART III: SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

1. Provide a more detailed description and explain the need for the goods, services or grant to supplement the response in Part I.

We are purchasing a MultiNet Mini, a plankton sampler with 5 closing nets, 2 electronic flowmeters, and an integrated depth meter. Zooplankton samples are typically collected using a single net to sample the entire water column. Critical information that is missing from these datasets are depth stratified zooplankton distribution and the ability to identify the presence of zooplankton patches (e.g. Calanus aggregations, the primary food source of the critically endangered North Atlantic Right Whale). The MultiNet Mini is one of the few depth-stratified zooplankton samples on the market, and the only one small enough to be deployed from the R/V Maine and without a conducting cable. Depth stratified zooplankton data is needed in the Gulf of Maine as we develop measures to reduce risk for the critically endangered NARW in a region that both supports foraging for whales and the American Lobster fishery, the most valuable single-species fishery in the U.S.

2. Provide a brief justification for the selected vendor to supplement the response in Part II. Reference the RFP number, if applicable.

Environmental Analytical Systems is the only vendor that makes a zooplankton sampler with multiple nets that is small enough to be deployed from the R/V Maine and can be deployed without a conducting cable. The MultiNet is specialized equipment that uniquely suits our needs, and is anticipated to be applicable to future projects within the Department and with collaborating partners.

3. Explain how the negotiated costs or rates are fair and reasonable; or how the funding was allocated to grantee.

The negotiated costs are fair and reasonable based on current market rates for equivalent technology. The nets can either be pre-programmed to shut at specific depths or, with a conducting cable, nets can be triggered to close live. Additionally, the MultiNet is designed to be towed either vertically or obliquely. Given this flexibility, the MultiNet is reasonably priced as it can be deployed from a range of vessels and oceanographic conditions.

4. Describe the plan for future competition for the goods or services.

Procuring the MultiNet is a one-time purchase. Should we need to update or replace the nets in the future, we will continue to explore other source options.
