The Office of Special Services and Inclusive Education (OSSIE) have developed their own inclusive education framework in collaboration with Katie Macleod. OSSIE is planning an Inclusion conference in the spring of 2025 to bring together as many Maine educators as possible to continue the momentum for Co Teaching, Universal Design for Learning (UDL) and the spread of inclusive education practices in Maine.

Dr. Maclead at Novak Educational Consulting was secured to fulfill the need for a keynote presenter (and 3 breakout sessions) for a conference providing professional development for the state of Maine educators to increase the use of inclusive practices for students with disabilities. This is in response to the high percentage of LRE the state has as indicated by IDEA.

Dr. Macleod has nearly 25 years of experience in education and is a highly regarded expert in the education field on UDL. UDL leads to more inclusive practices for students with disabilities. She designs and presents workshops nationally and internationally on WDL. She is bestselling author and an adjunct instructor at the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Maclead also lives in New England which negated higher travel costs.

3. Explain how the negotiated costs or rates are fair and reasonable; or how the funding was allocated to grantee.

The cost for Katie was comparable for a presenter in this field and Katie resides in New England, lowering her travel costs. Katie quoted us \$7500 for the keynote but added 3, 1 hour breakout sessions for another \$1,000 which allowed her to provide more specific professional development to the attendees.
