PART III: SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

1. Provide a more detailed description and explain the need for the goods, services or grant to supplement the response in Part I.

The Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife was established to 'preserve, protect and enhance the inland fisheries and wildlife resources of the state', and to 'promote the wise use' of those resources. In fall 2021, we became aware of the potential for contamination of deer by PFAS at levels that could impact human health and issued a 'Do Not Eat' advisory for deer meat in the Fairfield Area. This initial advisory was based on a relatively small sample of deer from a limited geographic area. As part of the State of Maine's overall response to PFAS contamination, MDIFW plans to sample additional deer and other wildlife species in the Fairfield area, as well as at other locations across the state to 1) refine the size and scope of the advisory in the Fairfield area, and 2) determine if additional consumption advisories are warranted in other locations. This will require lethally sampling wildlife during times of year when they are seasonally distributed and consuming forage similar to what hunters will encounter during established hunting seasons. Most of the sample collection will need to occur from May to August 2022 in order to provide updated information to hunters prior to the start of hunting seasons in October.

MDIFW does not have staff capacity or specialized equipment to complete this task.

USDA APHIS Wildlife Services is uniquely qualified to provide program support, equipment, traps, and staffing. They have specialized expertise lethally collecting wildlife in both rural and urban environments and are trained in biological sample collection. They have access to a nationwide network of specialists with experience working on a variety of wildlife species. Lethally removing wildlife requires a diverse set of specialized skills to be effective. Considering the entire diverse need, USDA APHIS Wildlife Services is the most feasible entity to work with.

3. Explain how the negotiated costs or rates are fair and reasonable; or how the funding was allocated to grantee.

As stated previously, we believe that USDA APHIS Wildlife Services has the total all-around experience with working with Maine's wildlife, including in populated urban areas. They have provided us with a reasonable budget of personnel compensation, vehicle costs, supplies and equipment to conduct wildlife sample collection.

If we become aware of another vendor with the expertise and equipment to complete the required work, we will establish a competitive process to select the most qualified vendor and competitive pricing.
