1. Provide a more detailed description and explain the need for the goods, services or grant to supplement the response in Part I.

The Maine Marine Patrol has identified the need for a second pilot with its recent purchase of a new \$3.5 million dollar turbine powered amphibious aircraft. The present Marine Patrol Pilot will require on-going recurrency training by an FAA Certified Flight Instructor (CFI/CFII) with extensive experience in turbine powered amphibious aircraft, as well extensive Instrument Flight experience.

2. Provide a brief justification for the selected vendor to supplement the response in Part II. Reference the RFP number, if applicable.

There are no other Certified Flight Instructors in the state system with the experience that Roger Wolverton has in amphibious turbine powered aircraft. He has extensive time training state pilots in float plane operations, bush like conditions, emergency procedures, and instrument flight as the former Chief Warden Pilot for the Maine Warden Service and Penobscot Island Air. Mr. Wolverton is a former airline transport pilot for American Eagle/American Airlines with extensive time logged flying throughout the continental United States. Mr. Wolverton has provided flight training to the Marine Patrol Pilot over the past 20 years. The Maine Marine Patrol sent Mr. Wolverton to Kodiak amphibious aircraft training at Parkwater Aviation in Spokane, Washington last year in order for him to be qualified to instruct in the bureau's new aircraft. He is also insured on the State of Maine's Aviation Insurance Policy.

3. Explain how the negotiated costs or rates are fair and reasonable; or how the funding was allocated to grantee.

Roger Wolverton's rates are in line with rates of other Certified Flight Instructors in the state.

4. Describe the plan for future competition for the goods or services.

The Maine Marine Patrol is always on the lookout for experienced Certified Flight Instructors with the ability to conduct amphibious float training in our unique operating environment, but it will be a loss to the state when Mr. Wolverton finally retires. We may need to go outside the State of Maine to find an instructor with the same level of experience as he has.
