1. Provide a more detailed description and explain the need for the goods, services or grant to supplement the response in Part I.

As part of the State of Maine's PFAS response, the Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife has been lethally sampling wildlife (primarily white-tailed deer and wild turkeys) for PFAS tissue analysis to assess the potential risk to hunters through consumption of PFAS-contaminated wild game. IFW's earlier work has resulted in consumption advisory areas in parts of Fairfield and Unity. IFW plans to sample additional deer and other wildlife species in other locations across the state to determine if additional PFAS consumption advisories are warranted. This will require lethally sampling wildlife during times of the year when they are seasonally distributed and consuming forage similar to what hunters will encounter during established hunting seasons. Most of the sample collection will occur intermittently from late spring through early fall.

2. Provide a brief justification for the selected vendor to supplement the response in Part II. Reference the RFP number, if applicable.

USDA APHIS Wildlife Services (WS) is uniquely qualified to provide program support, equipment, traps and staffing. WS has access to a nationwide network of specialists working with a variety of wildlife species. They have specialized expertise lethally collecting wildlife in both rural and urban settings, and their staff are trained in biological sample collection. Lethally removing wildlife requires a diverse set of specialized skills to be effective. Considering the variety and breadth of need, WS is the most feasible entity to work with for IFW's PFAS surveillance.

3. Explain how the negotiated costs or rates are fair and reasonable; or how the funding was allocated to grantee.

As stated above, WS has the total all-around expertise for working with Maine's wildlife, including in populated urban areas. WS has provided IFW with a reasonable budget of personnel compensation, supplies and equipment to conduct wildlife sample collection

If we become aware of another vendor that has the expertise and equipment to complete the required work, we will establish a competitive process to select the most qualified vendor and competitive pricing.
