1. Provide a more detailed description and explain the need for the goods, services or grant to supplement the response in Part I.

MS/EdD provides educational data management services to the Department regarding the eligibility, services, and link to the Migrant Student Information Exchange (MSIX) for eligible Migrant children in the Maine Migrant Education Program, Title I Part C. This includes the installation, use, and maintenance of the MIS2000 software, a Windows based relational database management system designed exclusively for use in Migrant education, Title I Part C.

2. Provide a brief justification for the selected vendor to supplement the response in Part II.

The Maine DOE has worked with MS/EdD for many years on the development and use of the MIS 2000 system to track migrant students' services and eligibility determinations. This company is the only vendor who has a product that provides the extensive customizing capability of the system needed for this program. No other system allows migrant education field recruiters to complete Certificates of Eligibility in electronic format and upload them daily into the system. MS/EdD staff is uniquely knowledgeable about migrant education data from the field level through federal reporting. MS/EdD has similar databases set up in 35 states that coordinate the Title 1 Part C Migrant Education Program and their experience with other states is valuable as the Maine Migrant Education Program continues to evolve to meet migratory children's needs. Their comprehensive knowledge ensures that students are promptly and correctly identified, made eligible, and provided services. An efficient, web-based, secure data system that integrates all program functions is critical to the success of this program.

3. Explain how the negotiated costs or rates are fair and reasonable; or how the funding was allocated to grantee.

The costs are fair and reasonable, based on previous years and compared to other student database systems. The vendor has agreed to waive costs for additional user licenses and committed to no price increases because of Maine's lower federal Title 1 Part C allocation in recent years. The vendor also agreed to waive the costs for temporary users as they will be using the system for less than a month/year (during blueberry harvest only).

4. Describe the plan for future competition for the goods or services.

Annually, the Maine Migrant Education Program team conducts research to determine if there are other products available that meet the requirements for this system. The team verifies this by speaking with other states about their student database systems and the federal Office of Migrant Education to confirm if there are other options to meet federal requirements. If new products do emerge, the team is committed to do an RFP.
