PART III: SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

1. Provide a more detailed description and explain the need for the goods, services or grant to supplement the response in Part I.

This purchase is part of a project in collaboration with GMRI, in which GMRI was awarded \$167,424 from the Maine Coastal and Marine Climate Fund (MCMCF) to develop an automated seagrass classification algorithm, hindcast seagrass distribution statewide, and develop a habitat suitability index for seagrass in Maine. The MCMCF funding covers GMRI staff time and resources, but does not enable the purchase of commercial satellite imagery. The Nature Conservancy provided an additional \$10,000 in support of this project to enable the purchase of the Planet Labs satellite imagery. Satellite imagery will be purchased and distributed to GMRI for a portion of the Maine coast, which will be used in training the automated seagrass classification algorithm. Ultimately, the algorithm will be shared with DEP and, if successful, applied to coastwide Planet Imagery that is available to DEP at no cost through the federal Commercial Satellite Data Acquisition (CSDA) Program, but which cannot be distributed to GMRI for algorithm development.

2. Provide a brief justification for the selected vendor to supplement the response in Part II. Reference the RFP number, if applicable.

The high-resolution satellite imagery provided by Planet Labs is unique in its historical archive of ~daily imagery of the entirety of the Maine coast since 2009, which enables hindcasting of seagrass distribution with sufficient accuracy relative to free, lower resolution satellite imagery and sufficient coverage relative to tasked high-resolution satellite imagery, as provided by other commercial satellite imagery vendors. Therefore, a grant from The Nature Conservancy was sought (and awarded) to enable the purchase of Planet Labs satellite imagery, specifically.

3. Explain how the negotiated costs or rates are fair and reasonable; or how the funding was allocated to grantee.

The negotiated rates are on par with commercial satellite imagery from other vendors, although provide a data product that is not available from those vendors. The cost of satellite imagery is considerably less than the cost of traditional aerial imagery acquired via fixed wing aircraft, which is currently used for seagrass mapping by the State. The use of satellite imagery could replace the purchase of traditional aerial imagery in the future, should this project prove a success.

4. Describe the plan for future competition for the goods or services.

If, in the future, the State possesses the technical ability (e.g., successful automated seagrass classification algorithm) to transition from the use of traditional aerial imagery to high-resolution

satellite imagery, Planet Labs imagery can be obtained at no cost through the federal CSDA program. However, should the State wish to purchase commercial satellite imagery that cannot be obtained via the CSDA program, an RFP would be released to select the vendor based on a competitive process.
