Qiagen instruments and accompanying supplies are used by the crime lab to perform DNA analysis in order to identify suspects, victims, and remains, and is a cornerstone of the criminal justice system in the state of Maine. The crime lab relies on Qiagen, a vetted and accredited supplier, for unique consumables and custom (Maine specific) "QIAcard" FTA cards used to collect, stabilize and preserve biological samples at room temperature. The FTA cards are ideal for long-term storage and archiving of forensic reference samples while meeting the Maine statutory specific protocols and requirements. Qiagen Micro Kits are essential for extraction and purification of more challenging trace evidence that we would otherwise be unusable due to minute amounts or degradation from elemental exposure.

Qiagen is a leading provider of DNA analysis solutions and has a long track record of providing excellent products and services to the Maine State Police Crime Lab. The Qiagen instruments and consumables currently in use at the lab have been previously validated, a laborious and time-consuming process, therefore we can only use these products in forensic DNA casework per QAS standards/protocols as required to maintain national accreditation status. We employ a validated process to quantitate our DNA extracts using current infrastructure/Qiagen instrumentation. Switching any products listed in the current master agreement would require a validation process for each one which would require a great deal of time and money.

3. Explain how the negotiated costs or rates are fair and reasonable; or how the funding was allocated to grantee.

Maine's Division of Procurement Services negotiates the terms of our master agreement based on total annual expenditure. In 2024 we purchased a Rotor Gene Instrument for \$57,737 and spent \$29,943 on consumable supplies. For the 7/10/2025 - 7/9/2026 period Qiagen has offered a 5% discount on master agreement items. This is deemed reasonable and appropriate considering historical expenditures.

In the future, should the need arise to change and validate new products and/or vendor, DPS will utilize statutorily correct competitive bid processes.
