1. Provide a more detailed description and explain the need for the goods, services or grant to supplement the response in Part I.

Equipment measures groundwater levels and conductivity in water wells for a long-term water resources monitoring network and saltwater intrusion studies. Includes telemetry equipment for sending collected data over cell networks for drought monitoring and other time-sensitive studies.

Without the equipment we will not have field equipment to deploy during the remainder of the 2025 field season, will not be able to keep up with the pace of installation that we promised for the CRRC Resilient Maine grant, and lose 8 or more months of unrecoverable monitoring data. This brand of monitoring equipment is also the only one that we currently use for real-time data collection, is already integrated into all of our network's cloud and database infrastructure, and is the only system approved by OIT, so switching brands would add even more trouble to any delay.

2. Provide a brief justification for the selected vendor to supplement the response in Part II. Reference the solicitation (RFP/RFA/RFQ) number if applicable.

In-Situ is one of only a few manufacturers of this type of niche groundwater level and telemetry equipment. It is the only manufacturer and supplier whose equipment can fit in 2-inch monitoring wells to protect against vandalism without buying and installing additional locking boxes or vaults.

3. Explain how the negotiated costs or rates are fair and reasonable; or how the funding was allocated to grantee.

The quoted costs are below publicly available price quotes for similar equipment available on websites of In-Situ or other distributors like Fondriest.com. This type of all-in-one, special-purpose equipment is also less expensive than building our own telemetry systems with off-the-shelf components such as industrial gateways. Further this instrumentation is already deployed around the State as part of a 2024-25 groundwater monitoring mobilization. Continued use of InSitu equipment is vital for the efficient streamlining of future data collection and synthesis with recently collected groundwater data.
