1. Provide a more detailed description and explain the need for the goods, services or grant to supplement the response in Part I.

Per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) are synthetic chemicals that repel oil, grease, water, and heat. PFAS are widespread and persistent in the environment. Farmland containing PFAS can contaminate soils, water, crops, and livestock to the extent that they are unsafe for human consumption (and, in the case of forage crops, unsafe for feeding livestock).

The purpose of this Contract is to perform laboratory analysis of samples for the presence of per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) at commercial farms. Sample media may be milk, manure, sludge, soil, groundwater, surface water, vegetative material and/or tissue, animal tissue, and other types as necessary and agreed upon in accordance with all applicable testing protocols and industry standards, including certification requirements. Sample testing allows for DACF, in coordination with the Maine CDC, to understand where the contamination is on the farm and assist the producer in making a plan to depurate the substance to a low level, ensuring a safe and reliable product.

2. Provide a brief justification for the selected vendor to supplement the response in Part II. Reference the RFP number, if applicable.

The Department of Agriculture, Conservation & Forestry (DACF) uses multiple PFAS laboratory testing services under this CTMV due to the nature of PFAS sampling and testing. The laboratories used have been approved by the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP); see CTB 20181211*0037. Some PFAS laboratory testing services only test plant tissue, water, soil, and milk. Others specifically test animal tissue. Multiple laboratories are needed in order to have flexibility to switch when fast turnaround times for testing results are essential, or to provide additional confidence in testing results by having multiple laboratories analyze the sample.

3. Explain how the negotiated costs or rates are fair and reasonable; or how the funding was allocated to grantee.

Vendors are paid based on quotes that the DACF requested for testing, on a variety of media and analysis methodologies, for the presence of Per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS). For each type of media, pricing is provided for the following 4 "Turn Around Times" (TAT): 20 business days,15 business days,10 business days & 5 business days. TAT defines when the lab results will be sent to BAFRR. TAT is strictly monitored, and laboratories are held to the pricing structure originally agreed upon.

There are limited labs who test for PFAS, particularly for some of the media tested by DACF. The labs included in this CTMV have proven their ability to deliver reliable services. Prices are relatively consistent among the labs, indicating they are fair and reasonable for this type of service.

4. Describe the plan for future competition for the goods or services.

If new laboratories are qualified by DEP for testing PFAS, particularly the unusual media DACF may require testing for (milk, manure, etc.), DACF would request quotes for services. If the new
