I. Summary

The Maine Department of Public Safety was seeking proposals from eligible applicants for grant projects under the STOP (Services • Training • Officers • Prosecutors) Violence Against Women Formula Grant Program (STOP Program) to support Maine communities in their efforts to develop and strengthen effective law enforcement and prosecution strategies to respond to violent crimes against women and to develop and strengthen victim services in cases involving violent crimes against women. Violence against women crimes include sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence and stalking. Eligible applicants were state and units of local government; Indian tribal governments; courts, tribal courts, the Administrative Office of the Courts; public or private nonprofit organizations; victim services programs; community-based organizations; and, faith-based organizations in Maine.

Reviewer appreciates how the applicant identified the specific timeline in the proposal. However, the reviewer also notes that the timeline provided for this project in the grant narrative is 12 months, yet the span of the project outlined on the cover page is far longer.

- 2. Provide and attend training for law enforcement officers and prosecutors
- 3. Develop and implement more effective prosecution protocols
- 4. Support multidisciplinary team efforts

Reviewer appreciates how the applicant clearly identifies the goals, objectives, activities, and timeline for each task. The reviewer was able to clearly understand the intention of the project and the scope of work to be done.

Reviewer notes that the outlined activities appear to align with the RFP and support increasing safety for survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault.

Reviewer notes that the two victim service organizations listed in the applicant appear to have a strong collaborative foundation with the lead applicant. Reviewer believe that the lead applicant has the necessary capacity to carry out a successful project.

Reviewer observes that the total funds requested from JAC equals \$262,479 with \$131,239.5 listed as match. Giving this application a match of 50%

TTD has dedicated staff and volunteers who provide a range of support services. All new staff and volunteers complete a 44-hour training facilitated by experienced TTD staff with continuing education expectations. Additionally, TTD accepts both bachelor's and master's levels interns to work alongside our employees. The proposed activities in this grant will be overseen by the Director of Advocacy and Victim Services, Jen LaChance, who has a lengthy tenure at the organization and has been overseeing advocacy work within correctional settings since 2005.
