**Award Justification Statement**  
**RFP# 202403062 – PFML Contributions Collection Online Portal**

- I. **Summary** The Department of Labor (MDOL), as part of implementing the State’s Paid Family and Medical Leave program (PFML), needs to partner with a vendor to create an online portal through which employers, and self-employed people electing coverage, will interact with the State. Employers will go to the portal to report and remit premium contributions for their PFML coverage. Employers will also go to the portal if they would like to seek an exemption from the program based on a substitution of benefits through a private to cover their employees. Self-employed people will go to the portal if they want to elect coverage, or opt in to the program.
  
- II. **Evaluation Process** The four-person evaluation team reviewed each proposal individually, and then met to score the proposals as a group. Evaluation team members have expertise in the areas of IT, state government contracting, PFML processes, and vendor oversight.
  
- III. **Qualifications & Experience** The evaluation team noted that the awarded bidder:
  - a. Has PFML experience in two other states
  - b. Is a current vendor with a good working relationship with Maine Revenue Service
  - c. Has an established history as a company doing similar work
  
- IV. **Proposed Services** The evaluation team noted that the awarded bidder:
  - a. Presented a thorough and clear proposal
  - b. Estimated that 85-90% of the functionality needed is already supported by their product
  - c. Identified a process by which to address payments from cannabis industry employers, as requested
  - d. Spoke to data from UI and other systems being uploaded or integrated into the portal they will deliver
  - e. Included that portal materials can be presented in multiple languages
  
- V. **Cost Proposal** The awarded bidder was entitled to 22 out of 25 available points based on its cost proposal, as compared to the lowest of all bidders’ cost proposals.
  
- VI. **Conclusion** The awarded bidder’s proposal materials, content, and experience leads all members of the evaluation team to believe that the awarded bidder will deliver a contribution collections portal that will allow the PFML program to be successful.

- Organization currently is working with State of Maine through Maine Revenue Services (MRS). MRS gave good feedback about the product that is used by them.
- The organization has been in business since 1997 and has established a nationwide set of experiences in both unemployment insurance and paid family and medical leave. The organization has 30 plus years of experience in the world of unemployment insurance and PFML.
- No subcontractors will be used for this project.
- Proposals were formatted in a way that was easy to read and to review.
- Mass PFML implementation was about 6 months which was impressive. The one year in Oregon was more complex due to modernization of both the PFML and UI program. 6-month implementation time for portal which is in line with what Maine PFML is looking for.

- Proposal provides a thorough resource and exploration of how the proposal will meet Maine PFML's needs.
- In Appendix D- Proposal made no exceptions which makes a sound and presentable offering.
- The proposal spoke to most if not all functionalities of what a portal would develop into. The proposal also offers multiple components within its product that makes this easy and can be integrated within MDOL website.
- Accounting was done with general accounting principles and had robust appeal and tracking system.
- The proposal will allow for multiple language functions to be developed within the portal, which is a plus.
- The portal will establish a process to collect payments from cannabis business which is a plus.
- The proposal outlines a strong private plan infrastructure within the proposed portal.
- The portal will allow for the importing of data from UI to other systems and allows for TPA's and employers' easy access to upload information.
- 85-90 percent of the offered product is ready to go except for a few components that need additional coding.
- The portal projects to have a strong financial and compliance systems, billing reminders and robust notification system for employers.

- Organization formed in 2015. Claimed to have a strong background in unemployment. But was not clear into any work done in paid family and medical leave.
- Will use subcontractor for this project.
- The organization chart was sparse. Not a clear path on how individuals will be used for this project. There was a mention of the Minnesota Paid Leave program and was left confused as to why Minnesota was there. Maybe an error?
- Has done work with Massachusetts paid leave claims processing and organization also worked on projects with veterans' affairs but only appeals system.
- A lot of errors and typos in the proposals mixing information about other PFML states and inaccurate information about Maine PFML.
- Has no direct experience in what Maine PFML is looking for with developing a contributions portal.
- The proposal misrepresented the size of Maine's workforce and the go-live date for Maine PFML.

- Proposed basic but adequate plan for how to perform the work but concerned as to the time certain components will be implemented on time.
- No issues with policy and process within Appendix D but has some overall concerns with the proposed services.
- Liked the way they designed a system to flag any inconsistencies in errors in the portal. Also liked their model of developing a transparent system.
- The proposal indicated there is a fundamental misunderstanding as to what needs to happen in developing a contributions portal for Maine PFML.
- There were some concerns about how much of the product is ready to go in terms of having a minimal viable product and whether they can meet the deadlines in our timeline.
- Graphics presented on integration with UI, Pay Maine and MRS were clear.
- One benefit is that the portal is one Maine could potentially own in the future.
- The system creates a human centered approach with creating language accessibility. This is a positive.

- Proposal provides five pages to exceptions in the appendix related to IT which raises a concern. This may be something our Assistant Attorney General's (AAG's) need to sort out with components of IT and the portal.
- The implementation workplan was strong and outlines a strong project management plan.
- The proposal assumes a large Maine IT Infrastructure. There is an expectation in the proposal to hand off the portal and other supporting components to the State which the question of how much in long-term costs are necessary with having to operate and maintain the portal. The State will also have to purchase many licenses as well which could increase costs.
- The proposal does not outline how the portal will collect contributions from cannabis business and collecting contributions. Seemed to be dismissive.
- There is a concern about the types of reports the portal will provide to Maine PFML.
- The work plan appears to be thorough enough to meet Maine PFML's needs. However, costs are not included in the workplan such as the implementation team having to travel to Maine if necessary.
- Liked the proactive anticipation of obstacles that will come in developing the portal.
