I. Summary

Through RFP# 202407137 Drinking Water Licensing System, the Department sought proposals to replace the Safe Water Operator Certification System (SWOCS) with a configurable COTS-SaaS licensing application. Three (3) Bidders responded to the RFP:

Bresa Tech LLC dba Bresatech Global Environmental Consulting, Inc. (GEC) Ignapius Inc. (dba Ignatius)

Through the evaluation process, Global Environmental Consulting, Inc. (GEC) received the highest score and was determined to provide the best value to the State of Maine.

II. Eligibility and Evaluation Process

An Evaluation Team, composed of five (5) State employees, verified the Bidders' eligibility requirements and applied the consensus method in scoring the Bidders' Qualifications & Experience and Proposed Services. Scores for the Cost Proposals were assigned using a mathematical formula.

III. Qualifications & Experience of Conditional Awardee

GEC offered an accomplished, experience-laden portfolio demonstrating the ability to deliver the services required by the RFP and successfully perform under the prospective contract.

IV. Proposed Services by Conditional Awardee

- It is unclear how much Department staff time would be required for the development via Agile Scrums.

Demonstrations (Stage Four)

- Software appears to be capable of receiving applications, administering certifications and receiving payments. However, it will take a significant outlay of time to configure appropriately, and it has unnecessary functionality that adds complexity to both the internal and external users.
- Dashboard is easy to follow.
- Inferred each license could be created fairly quickly by one person, but the steps demonstrated suggest the initial process for each type (OP, WD, etc.) would be time consuming and require considerable input from multiple DWP sections.
- Provided vague details concerning SDWIS integration which appears to lack an indepth knowledge of SDWIS complexity.
- Configuration of options seems unwieldy with too many options and lacked clarity of how to make changes.
- Cited Vermont as a current user example which relied heavily on State staff developing the forms that their system uses.
- Did not mention any reports or capability to export data to another application for analysis.
- No mention of proxy user for a particular location such as a water district.
