You mentioned rainwater & runoff plans. Are we ok to just use the accepted DEP biomulch as a berm material around stockpiles? Or is something more needed? And are there permits beyond the town code enforcement that need to be completed? RESPONSE: Expectation is that erosion control mix for sedimentation must be equal to Maine DEP requirements for erosion control berm mix. Contractors will be required to file permit paperwork for hazardous material removal with the state as well as permits for site abandonment of utilities with the town. Recycling is a big concern. Who owns the recycled material? Will we have to refund the state for everything we take out, and if so, how exactly will that be quantified? If we do not have to refund the state, and it is the contractor's material to do what they wish, then it's easy. But if we need to compensate the state, that could get very problematic.

Q5.	Please elaborate as to the intention of the foundations, footings and concrete slabs regarding what condition you want the site to be left in when the contract is complete. Are these to be removed completely or filled in? If the intention is to fill in the foundations, what material are we to use as aggregate and what is the expectation of the site work to be done under this contract after the foundation is filled in? Is the contractor required to furnish fill for "smooth grading" of the site after building removal?
	RESPONSE: Slabs, footings and foundations to be removed as part of base bid and as part of Add Alternates #1 and #2. Deduct Alternate #3 omits removal of footings and foundations in place in base bid buildings. Use Maine DOT granular borrow for foundation fill. Expectation is after building removal the surface will be smooth and uniform, loam seeded and mulched.
Q6.	It will be extremely difficult to complete this project, just the four base buildings, in the allotted amount of time. Lead paint, mercury, contaminated soils (pre-existing and as a result of the demolition), coolants, PCB's, and more are most certainly present and will have to be addressed. Not to mention the alternates, which will add a very substantial amount of time. What sort of extension or fluid timeline can be given?

Q11.	RESPONSE: Removal and disposal of universal waste items such as fluorescent lights and ballasts, emergency lights and mercury switches is part of base bid.

Q12.	RESPONSE: Capped where terminated at each building that is to be demolished so the existing water main can be used for all new and existing buildings to remain.
Q13.	Please elaborate on how you want us to handle utility disconnects and power requirements. Main power to the building will need to be terminated prior to demo of course. If that happens then there will be no power for us to perform our abatement work. Same would be for the water line coming in. Who is responsible for terminating the power to the building, turning the water off, and in turn who will provide us temp power, or if we are expected to take care of that ourselves under this contract?
Q13.	RESPONSE: DOC will arrange disconnects with Emera rolling the outages so that power will be disconnected as abatement is complete and ready for demo. Some coordination will have to be considered as some buildings are fed through others and if this becomes an issue there is a generator as a backup. All water is currently off at the source, water will be available at the reservoir to fill contractor supplied containers.
Q14.	Can you elaborate on the extent of shed removals? Most buildings have adjacent sheds and the plans ask to confirm with owner on removal. Are we expected to carry the price of demoing the sheds as well?
	RESPONSE: DOC will relocate newer shed adjacent to the rear of Building 8. All other sheds to be demolished or will be relocated prior to demolition.
	Please confirm that some limited fence removal will be permitted for this project.
Q15.	RESPONSE: The DOC will be removing a large section of fence prior to demolition which will provide access to the site that includes from the Motor Pool building,

behind the Administration Building to the far end of the Programs Building (#8). However, this fence could be used as construction site "security".

REMOVAL/DISPOSAL OF PCB AND MERCURY-CONTAINING MATERIALS

PART 1 - GENERAL

1.1 RELATED DOCUMENTS

- A. The specification sections "General Conditions of Contract", "Special Conditions" and "Division 01 General Requirements" form a part of this Section by this reference thereto, and shall have the same force and effect as if printed herewith in full.
- B. The Contractor is responsible to furnish all labor, materials, facilities, equipment, services, permits and agreements necessary to perform the work required for removal of PCB-containing ballasts, mercury-containing light tubes and mercury-containing thermostat devices in accordance with these specifications, and all local, state and federal regulations (40 CFR 761, Polychlorinated Biphenyls Manufacturing, Processing, Distribution in Commerce and Use Prohibitions); (49 CFR 178, Shipping Container Specifications).

1.2 SCOPE OF WORK

- A. Work required by this section includes removal, handling and disposal/recycling of all PCB-containing ballasts, mercury-containing fluorescent light tubes/high intensity lamps and mercury-containing thermostats.
- B. For the purpose of this project, all ballasts which do not have the term "No PCB's" printed on the label must be assumed to be PCB-containing and be removed and disposed as such. Ballasts which have the term "No PCB's" printed on the label may be disposed of as construction and demolition waste. Intact, non-leaking PCB containing ballasts (small capacitor) may be disposed as municipal solid waste, as allowed by regulation. Municipal solid waste landfills, at its option, may not accept non-leaking PCB-containing ballasts (small capacitor) due to permitting requirements. It is recommended that mercury fluorescent bulbs and mercury switch items shall be recycled, as applicable, as opposed to being treated as hazardous waste items per EPA disposal as outlined in Part 6.
- C. The Contractor shall be responsible to verify all material quantities and to determine job site conditions.

PART 2 - ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENTS

Use special clothing, including, but not limited to: disposable gloves (polyethylene) and eye protection.

PART 3 - WORK OPERATIONS

- 3.1 Ensure that work operations or processes involving PCB ballasts, PCB-containing materials and mercury are conducted in accordance with 40 CFR 761 and the applicable requirements of this section, including, but not limited to:
 - A. Obtaining advance arrangements of recycling/disposal sites
 - B. Notifying Contracting Officer prior to commencing the operation.
 - C. Reporting leaks/spills to the Contracting Officer
 - D. Cleaning up spills.
 - E. Inspecting waste containers for leaks and forwarding copies of inspection reports to the Contracting Officer.
 - F. Maintaining inspection, inventory and spill records.
- 3.2 Spill/Cleanup requirements:
 - A. Immediately report to the Contracting Officer any PCB or mercury spills/leaks.
 - B. Rope off area round edges of leak or spill and post caution signs at the area.
 - C. Initiate cleanup of spills as soon as possible. Mop up any liquid with rags or other conventional absorbent. The spent absorbent shall be properly contained and disposed as solid waste.
 - D. Document the cleanup with records of decontamination in accordance with 40 CFR 761, Section 125, Requirements for PCB Spill Cleanup. Provide certification of decontamination.

PART 4 - STORAGE/LABELING OF CONTAINERS

- 4.1 Store materials in DOT Specification 5, 5B or 17C containers with removable heads per 49 CFR 178. Boxes shall be suitable for fluorescent light tubes. Label containers with the following:
 - A. Date the item was placed in storage and the name of the cognizant activity and building.
 - B. Affix caution labels to all hazardous waste containers.

PART 5 - IDENTIFICATION NUMBER

5.1 Identification Number - Federal regulations require that generators, transporters, commercial storers and disposers of regulated hazardous waste possess U.S. EPA identification numbers. The Contractor shall verify that the activity has a U.S. EPA generator identification number for use on the Uniform Hazardous Waste Manifest (EPA Form 8700-22). If not, the Contractor shall advise Contracting Officer that it must file and obtain an identification number with EPA prior to commencement of removal work. (Not applicable to item listed in 6.01)

PART 6 - TRANSPORTER CERTIFICATION/CERTIFICATE OF DISPOSAL

- 6.1 Comply with disposal requirements and procedures as outlined in 40 CFR.
 - A. Intact non-leaking PCB-containing ballasts (small capacitor) may be disposed of as municipal solid waste per 40 CFR 761.60(b)(2)(ii). Ensure that the municipal solid waste landfill will accept non-leaking PCB-containing ballasts before transport.
 - B. Mercury containing fluorescent lamp bulbs may be recycled as universal waste, as an option, instead of a hazardous waste.
 - C. Mercury containing thermostats may be recycled as universal waste, as an option, instead of hazardous waste. DEP at their option, may accept mercury as a small quantity exempt generator on a one time basis only. Call for information at (207) 287-7884.
- 6.2 Certificate for the hazardous materials disposed of/recycled shall include:
 - A. The identity of the disposal facility by name, address and EPA identification number.
 - B. The identity of the hazardous waste affected by the Certificate of Disposal including reference to the manifest number for shipment.
 - C. A statement certifying the fact of disposal/recycling of the identified hazardous waste, including the dates of disposal and identifying the disposal process used.
 - D. A certification (for PCB's) as identified in 40 CFR 761, Section 3.

The Laborer classifications include a wide range of work duties. Therefore, if any specific occupation to be employed on this project is not listed in this determination, call the Bureau of Labor Standards at the above number for further clarification.

Welders are classified in the trade to which the welding is incidental.

Apprentices – The minimum wage rate for registered apprentices are those set forth in the standards and policies of the Maine State Apprenticeship and Training Council for approved apprenticeship programs.

Title 26 §1310 requires that a clearly legible statement of all fair minimum wage and benefits rates to be paid the several classes of laborers, workers and mechanics employed on the construction on the public work must be kept posted in a prominent and easily accessible place at the site by each contractor and subcontractor subject to sections 1304 to 1313.

Appeal – Any person affected by the determination of these rates may appeal to the Commissioner of Labor by filing a written notice with the Commissioner stating the specific grounds of the objection within ten (10) days from the filing of these rates.
