#### Cultural Building Asbestos Abatement & Mechanical Upgrades - Phase 2: Mechanical Upgrades & **Museum Abatement** PT 3108

The Phase 2 project work consists of asbestos abatement throughout selected areas of the Cultural Building in Augusta, ME, including abatement of asbestos containing materials (ACM) and contaminated materials; and limited removal of the mechanical system components, electrical and fire alarm fixtures and devices, and architectural features to support the abatement work. The work consists of partial renovatoin throughout the entire building, including areas previously abated under separate contract. Upgrades include replacement of the mechanical system, electrical and architectural upgrades necessitated by the abatement and mechanical work, minor structural repairs, and other Work included in the Contract Documents. The work also includes protection of identified exhibits within the Museum galleries to protect the collections and facilitate the abatement and construction activities.

The cost of the work is approximately \$ 9,200,000. The work to be performed under this contract shall be completed on or before the Final Completion date of 15 November 2023.
