Section 23 31 13, Part 3.7 indicates that the Contractor is responsible for cleaning the entire duct system (including installation of access hatches & removal/reinstallation of ceilings as required for the duct cleaning) if the test finds the net weight of debris exceeds the acceptable cleanliness level. Please confirm that the Contractor is responsible to cover these costs in the bid.

#### Response to Question 1:

Yes, the contractor is responsible for duct testing and cleaning.

## Question 2:

Drawing MD101 – Removal Keynote 3 calls for removing insulation from existing supply and return duct. There is no note calling for the duct insulation to be reinstalled. Please confirm.

Yes, the contractor is responsible for providing duct installation on all duct served by MUA-E-2. Drawing MH102 has been updated to show duct insulation installation.

## Question 3:

Specification Section 007346 Wage Determination Schedule is blank and does not contain any rates. Please provide the applicable rate sheet for this project at your earliest convenience.




SECOND FLOOR

1 MECHANICAL DUCTWORK PLAN


