
Demographics

Maine is the 42nd largest state in the U.S. (in terms of population)


2020 Decennial Population = 1,362,359


Population growth of 2.6% from 2010-2020 (42nd in U.S.)

Population growth of 1.7% from 2020-2022 (14th in U.S.)




Population growth has varied over the last two decades Births and Deaths per year in Maine






Components of Population Change, Maine

2022 net migration rate was **11th** in U.S.




It's some of Maine's most rural counties that have the highest <u>rates</u> of population growth 44% of those migrating to Maine in 2021 were under the age of 35




Maine has the oldest population... ...by median age (44.7 years) ...and by % of population age 65+ (21.7%)


Maine was the ONLY state in the U.S. to see a decrease in median age from 2020 to 2021




This index tells us the chance that two people selected at random will be from different race or ethnicity groups

- In 2020, Maine ranked as the least diverse state in the U.S. (ME index = 18.5% versus US index = 61.1%)
 - HOWEVER, there is regional variation...


...and variation across age groups

Who is in the labor force?


People who are employed

- People who are unemployed and not looking for work (might be caring for children or older parents; might be in college full-time)


Maine Civilian Labor Force




From Maine Dept. of Labor's *Annual Workforce Report for 2021* (pub. Nov. 2022):

- The rising share of retired population is the primary factor in lower participation in the state

- A higher share of retirement age population is the reason total labor force participation is lower in Maine than the nation




Total Nonfarm Employment (in thousands) History and CEFC forecast






Share of Maine Real GDP by Metropolitan Area











According to the Maine Department of Labor's Employment Outlook to 2030, the relative shares are not expected to change by much (the same sectors are still expected to be the largest)




Nonprofit Employment as Percentage of Total Private Employment, 2017




Nonprofit organizations are responsible for about 10% of total U.S. private sector employment.

Maine (18%) is ranked <u>third</u>, only behind Washington D.C. and Vermont.






Nonemployer Businesses, Percent Minority Owned: Maine, 2019

— PCE Price Index, 2012=100, seasonally adjusted




CPI is released by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and is based on surveys of urban consumers

PCE is calculated by the Bureau of Economic Analysis and is based on surveys of what businesses are selling


Federal Reserve focuses on the PCE in monetary policy decisions



Median Earnings by Race/Ethnicity and Sex, Maine




Major Components of Personal Income, Maine

In April, the CEFC revised employment and total personal income forecasts **UP** for all years (2023 – 2027)

One key assumption from April 2023 Consensus Economic Forecasting Commission report (emphasis added):


There is an unequal distribution of supply and demand in the labor market. Demand for labor is high, supply is low, and unemployment rates are near historic lows in Maine and nationwide.


Workers are experiencing higher wage growth, particularly for lower wage jobs. Some demographic trends, including a growing share of the population reaching retirement age, will continue to constrain labor supply.

However, the Commission is optimistic that Maine will continue to see <u>higher in-migration of working-</u> <u>age people</u> in the coming years that will be more than sufficient to offset retirements in the forecast period. Maine's outlook upgraded from 'stable' to 'positive' in recent credit rating

Moody's attributed its upgrade of Maine to 'positive' because of Maine's "<u>continued GDP</u> <u>growth at or above the national rate</u>" and Maine's <u>growing population and employment</u> <u>rates</u>.

Consumer sentiment has been trending up since its all-time-low in June 2022 – **but has now (April** 2023) lost about half of those gains.

There have been significant declines in short- and long-term economic outlook, mirroring the 2011 debt ceiling crisis. Inflation and labor quality remain top issues facing small businesses

NAICS	General Definition
Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting	primarily engaged in growing crops, raising animals, harvesting timber or fish and other animals
Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction	extract naturally occurring mineral solids, such as coal and ores; liquid materials, such as crude petroleum, and gases such as natural gas
Utilities	utility services: electric power, natural gas, steam supply, water supply, and sewage treatment and disposal
Construction	construction of buildings or engineering projects
Manufacturing	the mechanical, physical, or chemical transformation of materials, substances or components into new products
Wholesale Trade	wholesaling merchandise - generally without transformation - and rending services incidental to the sale of merchandise (an intermediate step in distribution of merchandise)
Retail Trade	retailing merchandise - generally without transformation - final stop in the distribution of merchandise
Transportation and Warehousing	provide transportation of passengers and cargo, warehousing and storage for goods, scenic and sightseeing transportation, and support activities related to modes of transportation
Information	production and distribution of information and cultural products, providing means to transmit or distribute these products, and data processing (e.g.
Finance and Insurance	engaging in financial transactions and or/in facilitation financial transactions
Real Estate and Rental and Leasing	renting, leasing, or otherwise allowing the use of trangible and intangible assets (e.g., real estate)
Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services	specialize in performing professional, scientific, and technical activities for others - legal advice, payroll, architecture, veterinary services, photographic services, specialized design services, computer services, consulting
Management of Companies and Enterprises	establishments that hold the securities of (or other equities interest in) companies and enterprises for the purpose of owning a controlling interest or influencing management decisions
Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services	comprise establishments performing routine support activities for day-to-day operations of other organizations (clerical work, cleaning, surveillance etc.)
Educational Services	provide instruction and training in a wide variety of subjects (schools, colleges, training centers)
Health Care and Social Assistance	provide health care and social assistance for individuals
Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation	operate facilities or provide services to meet varied cultural, entertainment, or recreational interests of their patrons
Accommodation and Food Services	provide lodging and/or preparing meals/snacks/beverages for immediate consumption
Other Services (except Public Administration)	provide services not capture elsewhere (e.g., grantmaking, advocacy, death care services, dating services)
