


### Population of Aroostook County, 1960-2020


#### Decennial Population (Towns with Population of 2,000+ in 2020)


### Aroostook County Population, April 1, 2020 - July 1, 2022 (# and % Change from Prior Year)












Aroostook County, 2030, Projected Population






#### Share of 2020 Population by Race/Ethnicity Excluding Non-Hispanic White Alone







#### % Living with a Disability by Age Group








### Annual Average Civilian Labor Force - Maine


### Annual Average Civilian Labor Force Aroostook County




#### Employment by Industry, Aroostook County, 2017-2021

# Labor Force Statistics – Context



Labor Force <u>Includes</u>:


- Wage and salary workers
- Self-employed
- Temporarily absent from job
- Certain unpaid family workers
- Unemployed and seeking work in the last four weeks

Civilian Noninstitutional Population Includes:

- Population 16 years and older who do not live in an institutional setting (e.g. jails, nursing homes) and are not active military
- Foreign citizens who reside in the U.S.


# "Other Marginally Attached"

	Current Population Survey	American Community Survey
Frequency	Monthly	Annual
Most Recent Data	July 2023	2021 (Populations of 65,000 or more) 2017-2021 avg. (Populations of <65,000)
Sample Size	Small – 60,000 households/month	Larger – 3 million households/year
Population "Universe"	Civilian, noninstitutionalized population 16 years or older	Population 16 years or older (military excluded for certain tables)
Employment Status Information	More detailed questions specific to employment status	General purpose economic/social/housing survey that includes employment information
Labor Force Demographics	Available at larger geographies (e.g. state, national)	Available for large and small geographies (but be aware of margins of error)

Other differences: question wording, timing, nonresponse rate






#### Labor Force Participation Rates by Age Group (2017-2021)












#### Labor Force Participation Rates by Sex (2017-2021) Ages 20-64


#### Labor Force Participation Rates, Females with Minor Children Age 20-64




### Labor Force Participation Rates by Disability Status Age 16+
