




Population of Maine (1960-2040)

Components of Population Change, Maine




- •Population Increase from 2010-2020: 2.6% (42nd in the U.S.)

Aroostook County Population, April 1, 2020 - July 1, 2022 (# and % Change from Prior Year)




Components of Population Change in Maine, 2021-2022 Rate per thousand population


Aroostook County, 2020, Observed population









Aroostook County, 2030, Projected Population




Share of 2020 Population by Race/Ethnicity Excluding Non-Hispanic White Alone




Share of 2020 Population by Race/Ethnicity Excluding White Alone




Racial and Ethnic Diversity Index by Age Maine, 2020




Educational Attainment of Population Age 25+



Share of Maine Nonfarm Employment by Industry




Annual Average Civilian Labor Force - Maine







Annual Average Civilian Labor Force Aroostook County




Annual Average Unemployment Rate





Labor Force Participation Rates by Age Group (2017-2021)




Labor Force Participation - State Level









Labor Force Participation Rates by Educational Attainment (Age 25-64)




Moving Four Quarter Average Wage Per Job


Median Home Prices, 2012-2022
